Notes on using the Finding Aid

First consult the fonds description (fonds being an archival term used to denote the whole of the records created by a specific individual or family and held within an archives). The fonds description includes a biographical sketch of the individual or family that created the records, a scope and content note which briefly describes the records within the fonds (this generally starts with "Fonds consists of..."), and several notes at the bottom, which provide information on access restrictions and copyright restrictions.

Some finding aids also provide series descriptions on subsequent pages which further describe the records within the fonds.

After reading these descriptions consult the file list and notify an archivist of the individual files you wish to view.

Fonds Description

John Morton family fonds. – 1856-1915. – 1.82 m of textual records (13 boxes). – 29 photographs. – 7 postcards.

John Morton (1839-1912) was a Presbyterian minister, and founder and leader of a mission to Trinidad. He married Sarah Silver, in 1863, with whom he had three sons - Arthur, Harvey and William - and one daughter, Agnes. Morton was born in Nova Scotia, and attended school at Little Harbour, and Albion Mines (Stellarton), before entering the Free Church College at Halifax, in 1855. He graduated in 1861, and in December of that year, was ordained to the charge of Bridgewater. Due to ill-health, he felt a need to leave the Maritimes for the winter, and travelled to Trinidad in 1864. While there, he became interested in the lives of the East Indians. who in the twenty years prior to 1864 had been brought to the island as labour. The East Indians consisted of about 25% of the population, but were largely ignored by the churches on the island. Morton remained in Trinidad for four months but was unable to press the local Presbyterian churches to minister to the East Indians. He brought the matter before the Synod of the Presbyterian Church of the Lower Provinces, which agreed to establish a mission in Trinidad, to be led by Morton. On January 3rd, 1868, he and his wife and daughter arrived in Port of Spain. His mission was originally set up in lere Village, but in 1871, the family moved to San Fernando. In 1875, they moved back to the lere area and settled in a town called Princetown. In 1881 they moved north to Tunapuna, where they remained until John Morton died in 1912. While in Trinidad, Morton emphasised education as well as religion, and was active in establishing schools and teaching the East Indians. Through John Morton's help, a teacher's training college was established in San Fernando, as well as a theological training school.

Mrs. Sarah Morton, served with her husband in Trinidad, and following his death, published a book on the life of her husband. Their son, Dr. Arthur Silver Morton was born in 1870 in lere, Trinidad. Arthur Morton was educated at Queen's Royal College, Port of Spain, and the University of Edinburgh, where he received his M.A. degree and an honours Bachelor of Divinity degree. He moved to Canada in 1896 and was ordained by the Presbytery of St. John, N.B. After serving in three charges in New Brunswick – Shediac, Fairville, and St. Stephen – he lectured in church history at the Presbyterian College in Halifax from 1904-1907. From 1907 until 1912 he lived in England where he conducted research work on the historical geography of the Roman Empire and the Middle Ages. In 1912 he was asked to lecture in church history at Knox College, and in 1914 became Professor of History at the University of Saskatchewan. He published a number of books on Canadian history, including *History of the Prairie Settlement*, and *History of the Canadian West to 1870*. After his retirement from the University of Saskatchewan, he was appointed Provincial Archivist of Saskatchewan. Harvey Morton, also became a minister and was ordained by the Presbytery of St. John in 1897. He also served in Tunapuna, Trinidad for a number of years.

The fonds is arranged into four sous-fonds: the Papers of John Morton; the Papers of Sarah Morton; the Papers of Arthur S. Morton; and the Papers of Harvey S. Morton. The papers of John Morton consist of correspondence, letterbooks, reports, sermons and addresses, and various booklets and pamphlets regarding Trinidad. The papers of Mrs. Sarah Morton (wife of John Morton) consist of correspondence, scrapbooks and clippings concerning John Morton, several photographs and postcards, and the original typescript and research notes for her book "John Morton of Trinidad". The papers of Arthur S. Morton consist of correspondence with friends and family, and genealogical research notes he compiled on the Silver family. The papers of Harvey Morton consists of a small file of correspondence.

Sous-fonds Descriptions

Papers of Sarah Morton. – 1856-1915, predominant 1864-1915. – 78 cm of textual records. – 25 photographs. – 7 postcards.

Sous-fonds consists of the original typescript plus research notes for a book written by Mrs. Morton on her husband entitled "John Morton of Trinidad". The series also consists of correspondence of Mrs. Morton with various family members, primarily her son Arthur S. Morton; scrapbooks and clippings on the life and work of John Morton; photographs of people and places in Trinidad; and a few postcards. The draft, or original typescript, version of Mrs. Morton's book, which was published by William Briggs, consists of 8 chapters and follows the life of John Morton. Several files of research notes created by Sarah Morton in writing her book also exist. The scrapbooks consists of 6 three-ring binders which contain clippings, letters and mementoes documenting the life of John Morton, and are arranged chronologically. The photographs in this series include pictures of various teachers and children in Tunapuna, a few pictures of Mrs. Morton, and pictures of churches and other buildings in Tunapuna. The postcards are of various buildings in St. Lucia.

Papers of John Morton. - 1861-1914. - 52 cm of textual records.

Sous-fonds consists of letters, reports, journals, sermons, addresses and other material documenting the work and life of John Morton – a missionary and educator of the East Indian people of Trinidad. Daily journals maintained by Morton exist for the years 1867-1873, 1875-1876, 1891, and 1900. Letter-books also exist for the years 1874-1875, 1877-1885, 1887, 1890-1893, 1900, and 1903. These letter-books also contain various reports written by Morton on his work in Trinidad. A few financial records also exist, including a book of stipends for the years 1861-1868, and a book of household expenditures, for 1863-1876. The series also contains various reference books and pamphlets presumably used by Morton, including a dictionary of English and East Indian words, a Hindi Hymn Book, the First Catechism in Hindi, and the Hindi First Book. A few personal mementoes of Morton, including his doctoral diploma and a scroll commemorating his Jubilee, are also included in the series.

Papers of Arthur S. Morton. – 1905-1914. – 38 cm of textual records. – 4 photographs.

Sous-fonds consists of correspondence and genealogical research notes of Arthur S. Morton. The correspondence includes letters received by Arthur S. Morton from his mother (1906-1914), his father (1908-1911), his brothers – Harvey Morton (1907-1911) and William Morton (1907-1910) – and his sisters-in-law (1906-1914). Other correspondence includes letters received from various friends and relatives over the period 1905-1914, including John Currie, Douglas Mollison, members of the Payzant family, A.J. Wm. Miles, Bertha Burleigh, G.S. Campbell, Louis and Agnes Silver, Gwendoline Sandham, and Robert Falconer. The genealogical research notes consist of work conducted by Arthur S. Morton on the Silver family (his mother's family). The photographs in the sous-fonds were sent to Arthur Morton by one of his brother's or by his sister, and are of his nieces and nephews. One of the photographs includes a picture of John Morton.

Papers of Harvey Morton. – 1894-1911. – 1 cm of textual records.

Sous-fonds consists of ten letters received by Harvey Morton from his mother, his sister Agnes, his brother Arthur, and from his father-in-law, J.G. Forbes. The letters were written in 1894 (one letter), 1895 (four letters), 1907 (one letter), 1909 (two letters), and 1911 (one letter). The last letter is undated.
