St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church, Hagersville was founded in 1883 as a mission of the First Gore Presbyterian Church, Oneida Township. St. Andrew's became a two-point charge with Oneida and their first minister, Rev Alexander Grant, served until 1886. St. Andrew's operated as a two-point charge with Oneida until 1890. A manse was built in 1901and a pipe organ was installed in 1917. In 1925 the congregation voted to remain within the Presbyterian Church in Canada.

Hamilton, Bermuda St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church

Historical Sketch

The congregation of St. Andrew's, Hamilton, Bermuda, was formed in 1843 in connection with the Church of Scotland and was linked with the congregation in Warwick, Bermuda. In 1845 both congregations voted to connect themselves with the Free Church of Scotland. In 1874 the congregation of St. Andrew's called the Rev. Kenneth Junor, assistant to the minister of Warwick, as their own minister, and as Junor was a Canadian, ordained in Halifax, the congregation voted to enter the Presbyterian Church in Canada and voted to remain in that denomination in 1925. The congregation was twinned with MacNab Street Presbyterian Church, Hamilton, ON in 1975.

Hamilton, Ontario **Calvin Grace Community Church**

Historical Sketch

Calvin Grace Community Church (Hamilton, ON)'s Presbyterian roots began in 1888. The church began as a Sunday School organized in 1888 by the young people of Knox Presbyterian Church. Knox congregation contributed to the construction of a new brick school building which was completed in 1889 and an addition was built in 1898. This Knox Church Mission evolved into a full congregation with the appointment of student ministers from Knox College, and in 1909 the congregation was established as Calvin Presbyterian Church. The first minister was Rev. H. D. Cameron who served from 1909 to 1910. An extension as added to the church in 1921 for more Sunday School space. In 1926 Calvin voted (65%) to remain within the Presbyterian Church. In 1936 a manse at 47 Macauley St. W. was purchased. Calvin and Knox Hamilton became a twopoint charge in 1967, then when Knox and Calvin were amalgamated in 1971, Knox Church was closed and the congregation moved to Calvin. In 1984 Calvin was united with Grace United Church and took the name of Calvin Grace Community Church with the minister remaining a member of the Presbyteries of Hamilton of both denominations.

Hamilton, Ontario Central Presbyterian Church

Historical Sketch

Central Presbyterian Church, Hamilton was established in 1841 after the Missionary Presbytery of the Canadas of the United Secession Church of Scotland, approved a petition from the people of Hamilton to be disjoined from the congregation at West Flamborough to form a separate congregation. Their first Minister, Rev. Thomas Christie under the United Secession Church of Scotland, preached on a part-time basis. The congregation was first known as the United Associate Church of Hamilton and met in a schoolhouse at MacNab and Jackson Streets (NW corner). The congregation built their first church in 1843 on Merrick Street and was known as the United Presbyterian Church by 1853. In 1847, the congregation called Rev. James Ritchie Dalrymple as their first Minister and he served until 1850. A larger second church, (named Central Presbyterian Church after 1860), was completed in 1858 on the site of the original school house where worship began. Central congregation founded Erskine Presbyterian Church first as the Pearl Street Mission in 1873 then as a separate congregation in 1880. They founded Westminster Church as well in 1903. When the church was destroyed by fire in 1906, the congregation met in the Sunday School (which survived the fire) until the third and present church on Charleton Avenue was completed in 1908. In 1925, Central voted narrowly (17 votes), to remain within the Presbyterian Church in Canada. The Sunday School and meeting rooms were expanded in 1960.

The first church building was completed in 1960 (East 42nd and 9th Avenue). The first minister was Rev. W. A. Smith, who was called in 1960 and served until 1962. The congregation became self-supporting in 1961. A new church building was completed in 1966.

Hamilton, Ontario Erskine Presbyterian Church

Historical Sketch

Erskine Presbyterian Church (Hamilton, ON) was established in 1873 as a mission of Central Presbyterian Church. In 1874 a Sunday School was completed on Pearl Street (between Florence and York). The congregation became self sustaining in 1880 a was named Erskine Presbyterian Church. In 1880 Rev. Thomas Scouler was called as Erskine's first Minister and he served until 1886. In 1884 a new (present) church was completed on Pearl Street. In 1896, a larger Sunday School building on Morden Street was completed and a pipe organ was installed in the church. Memorial Hall was built in 1922. In 1925 Erskine voted to remain within the Presbyterian Church in Canada.

Hamilton, Ontario Knox Presbyterian Church

See Calvin Grace Community Church (Hamilton, ON)

Historical Sketch

Following Disruption of 1843 in Scotland, a group left St. Andrew's Hamilton in 1844 and established Knox Presbyterian Church, Hamilton in connection with the Presbyterian Church of Canada. The minister of St. Andrew's, Hamilton, the Rev. Alexander Gale moved as well and became the first minister of Knox, serving until his appointment as principal of Knox College in 1846. This first Free Church in Hamilton worshipped at the Merrick Street Secessionist church (United Presbyterian) (1). In 1846 the congregation completed Knox's new church building and adjoining manse, at James and Cannon Streets (NE corner). In 1850 galleries were added in the church and in 1854, the congregation had grown sufficiently to warrant the establishment of a second congregation, known afterwards as MacNab Street Presbyterian Church. In 1861 the Free Church Synod and the United Presbyterian Synod were united becoming the Canada Presbyterian Church. Knox added two wings to the church building in 1865. A Sunday School building was erected in 1886, which was later razed to make room for a larger building in 1894. In 1888 a church extension made through the Young People's Missionary Society, established a Sunday School known as the Knox Church Mission and this became Calvin Presbyterian Church in 1909 (now Calvin Grace Community Church). Knox also sponsored the Wentworth Street Mission between 1865 and 1870. In 1925 Knox voted 90% in favour of remaining within the Presbyterian Church in Canada. In 1940 the sanctuary of Knox was completely destroyed by fire but a church was again rebuilt on the site in the 1950s. Knox was united with Calvin as a two-point charge in 1965 and was amalgamated with Calvin in 1971 and the James Street church was closed. Several of Knox's ministers are buried in the Knox plot in Hamilton Cemetery.

(1) The Merrick Street congregation built this church in 1839 and used it until 1858 when they moved to Jackson Street and became known as Central Presbyterian Church.

Note

There are a number of significant gaps in the records, notably marriages 1912-1950, burials pre-1965. Most of these gaps can be attributed to a fire in 1940 which destroyed the Church.

Hamilton, Ontario MacNab Presbyterian Church

Historical Sketch

MacNab Street Presbyterian Church, Hamilton was established in 1854 as Hamilton's second Free Church congregation. It began as a preaching station as an expansion of Knox Presbyterian Church Hamilton, Knox having expanded considerably since its beginning ten years before. Its first regular service was held in Mechanics' Hall, James Street North, with MacNab's first minister Rev. David Inglis officiating. The Rev. Inglis served from 1855, until in 1972 when he accepted a position as Professor at Knox College. A site for a new church was secured at Hunter and MacNab Streets and a first church was built in 1854. In 1857 a larger gothic stone church was completed. A significant contribution of \$6,000 was made toward this new building by Dr. Calvin McQueston, James Osborne and J. P. Dickenson. They had been Trustees of an American Presbyterian Organization in Hamilton which was closing and they turned the proceeds of the sale of this property over to MacNab. A stone manse was also built about that time. In 1873 MacNab gave financial support to bring St. John's Presbyterian Church into being. Also, in 1883 MacNab established a mission on Locke Street, known as St. James and later Westmount Presbyterian. MacNab began by renting premises for St. James and later acquired property and built a church, also on Locke Street (SW Corner Locke and Herkimer Streets). In 1878 St. James was established as a separate congregation. Also in 1878 the Sunday School was built and about 1900 a choir room and vestry were added. In 1925, MacNab voted overwhelmingly to remain within the Presbyterian Church. Extensive changes to the church sanctuary were completed in 1934 -- the floor was lowered, the galleries were removed, a new ceiling was built, stone pillars were erected and a chancel was added. A manse was purchased on Chedoke Avenue in 1955 or 1956 and the original MacNab Street manse was converted for use of the Sunday School in 1956.

Hamilton, Ontario St. John & St. Andrew Presbyterian Church

Historical Sketch

- St. John and St. Andrew Presbyterian Church was established in 1985, when St. Andrew's and St. John Presbyterian congregations were amalgamated.
- St. Andrew's began in 1856 as a mission charge, sponsored by "Old" St. Andrew's (now St. Paul's). The following year, a frame church was erected on Wentworth Street North by the congregation of Old St Andrew's and the newly-formed congregation called itself St. John Church. Economic changes caused the closing of St. John Church in 1860 and the building stood idle until it was opened as a mission under Knox Church in 1866. In 1870 the mission, known as the Wentworth Street Mission, was purchased from the congregation of "Old" St. Andrew's by the Canada Presbyterian Church and placed under the sponsorship of the congregations of Central, MacNab Street and Knox.
- When the new St. John congregation was organized in 1874 (see below), the Wentworth Street Mission was placed under their sponsorship. As the Mission grew, it was organized as an independent congregation in 1885, taking the name Wentworth Street Presbyterian Church. Their first minister was Rev. James Murray who served from 1888 to 1895. The congregation constructed a new brick church at Barton Street and Smith Avenue in 1887. The church was enlarged in 1889 and a Sunday School was built behind it 1893. In 1904, the congregation adopted the name St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church.
- A new St. John congregation was established in 1874 and their first minister was Rev. James Little who served from 1875 until 1877. After worshipping first at the Wentworth Street Mission, the congregation erected a brick building in 1874 at Emerald and Barton Sts. This served until a larger brick church was erected adjacent to it in 1890, with the original building converted to use as the Sunday School. Fire destroyed the church in 1940 and a new sanctuary was built within the existing walls soon after. A manse was purchased at 63 Melrose Avenue South in 1949 and the Sunday School was renovated in 1950.
- In 1925, both the St. Andrew's and the St. John congregations voted to remain within the Presbyterian Church, however, each lost a substantial number of their members who resigned to join the United Church of Canada.
- In 1983 St. Andrew's, St. John and St. David's were linked to form a three-point charge, and St. Andrews' church building was sold. In 1985 the amalgamated St. John and St. Andrew's congregations continued their link with St. David's as a two-point charge.

This congregation should not be confused with St. Paul's Church which was known as St. Andrew's from its establishment in 1830 until 1873 when the name St. Paul's was adopted.

Hamilton, Ontario St. Paul's Presbyterian Church

Historical Sketch

St. Paul's Presbyterian Church, Hamilton was established in 1833 as St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church in connection with the Established Church of Scotland. The first minister was Rev. Alexander Gale who was inducted in 1833. The congregation first worshipped in the Court House, Hamilton and it was within the Presbytery of York (now Toronto). In 1835 a small frame church was built on James Street (at Jackson Street) and it was twice enlarged. In 1836 the Presbytery of Hamilton was established. Following the Disruption of 1843 in Scotland, a group including the Rev. Alexander Gale, left St. Andrew's and established Knox Presbyterian Church in connection with the Presbyterian Church of Canada (Free Church). In 1855, a large stone church was built replacing the frame church on that site, the present St. Paul's church. The name St. Paul's was adapted in 1873 following the withdrawal of some members of the congregation who formed a separate congregation with the name of St. Andrew's. This second congregation re-united with St. Paul's in 1876. In 1925, the congregation voted to remain within the Presbyterian Church in Canada.

St. Paul's should not be confused with St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church which was established in 1856 as Wentworth Street Mission, sponsored by this original congregation "Old" St. Andrew's.

Hanover, Ontario St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church

Historical Sketch

St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church, Hanover, grew out of settlements of Presbyterians which gathered to the east around Camp Creek, now Allen Park and to the west around Maple Hill. The "Presbyterian Mission at Hanover" began in 1861, under the Synod of the Canada Presbyterian Church (Free). The Rev. Dr. Moffat the minister in Walkerton, conducted services for the mission in Gottwals Union Church (United Brethren Church) in Hanover . The first congregation was organized in 1868 by Rev. Dr. John M. King and that year was joined with the congregation of West Bentinck. In 1869, South Elderslie was added to make a three-point charge. Then from 1871 to 1879 Hanover and West Bentinck were linked.

A brick church was completed in 1873 at the corner of John Street and Durham Road on land donated by Hon. John McMurrick of Toronto. The first resident minister, Rev R.F. Gunn, was called by Hanover and West Bentinck and he served from 1874 to 1880. Mr. Robert McNally was elected the first elder in 1875. In 1879 West Bentinck was joined with North Brant and Hanover was joined with North Normanby (later Hampton). In 1905 a new church building was completed and called St. Andrew's, Hanover. A manse was purchased in 1919 at 576 10th Street in Hanover . In 1925, the Hampden congregation joined the United Church of Canada and St. Andrew's, Hanover, as part of the continuing Presbyterian Church, joined with Knox Church, Ayton forming a two-point charge, which has continued until the present day.

Harrington, Ontario Knox PresbyterianChurch

Historical Sketch

Knox Presbyterian Church, Harrington was established in 1857. The congregation built a church on a site donated by Mr. John Fraser and that year, called the Rev. William Meldrum as its first minister. He served until 1870. The Rev. Daniel Gordon was inducted in 1871 serving until his resignation in 1890. His son Charles W. Gordon, also became a minister of the church and gained fame as the outstanding Canadian writer "Ralph Connor". In 1891, the frame church building was moved nearer the road and the building brick veneered. A new brick manse was also built in 1897, replacing the frame structure built just to the east. The congregation was associated with Brooksdale from 1919 until 1925. That year with the Church Union vote, just under half the members and the minister left to join Broadview United Church. The Harrington congregation continued on its own and briefly (in 1927) Harrington came under the care of Knox, Embro in Paris Presbytery, although it was part of the Stratford Presbytery. In 1930, Burns Church, East Zorra and Harrington were linked and this arrangement continued until 1941 when Burns was linked with Tavistock and Harrington was transferred to Paris Presbytery and linked with Knox Embro, an arrangement which continues to the present day. The Acts and Proceedings of 1948 first associates the name Knox with the Harrington congregation that year.

Havelock, Ontario Knox Presbyterian Church

Historical Sketch

Knox Presbyterian Church (Havelock, Ont.) was established in 1885 as the Pinegrove Church, Belmont. By 1888, the congregation had left Pinegrove Church and had built a new church called Knox Presbyterian Church (Havelock, Ont.). The Rev. Hugh Brown was the first minister to be inducted to Knox. His ministry began in 1891. During the time of Church Union in 1925, Knox Presbyterian chose to remain with The Presbyterian Church in Canada. In 1937, Knox was united as a three point charge with the congregations at Hastings and Norwood. Hastings withdrew from this union in 1948.

Hawkesbury, Ontario St. Paul's Presbyterian Church

Historical Sketch

St. Paul's Presbyterian Church, Hawkesbury was established as a congregation in 1829. Their first minister was Rev. John McLaurin and he served both St. Paul's and a congregation in Orignal (possibly St. Andrew's) from 1829 until his death in 1833. Between 1833 and 1860 St. Paul's was linked with two congregations across the Ottawa River in Quebec, in Cushing (possibly St. Mungo's) and Grenville (possibly St. Gilles) under the ministry of Rev. William Mair. From 1860 to 1888, St. Paul's was linked once again with L'Orignal. In 1925 St. Paul's voted to remain within the Presbyterian Church, continued on its own until in 1977, the congregation formed a two-point charge with Knox, Vankleek Hill.

Services were held in the schoolhouse in near Hawkesbury Mills and some time later this building suffered major damage by weather and was repaired. The present church was built in 1870, the congregation worshipping in the Congregational Church until their to the new church was completed in 1871. A large manse was built in 1893 at the west end of Main Street, then in the early to mid 1950s, this was sold and a new manse was built on Stanley Street. The Stanley Street manse was sold about 1975. In 1961 a church hall was built adjacent to the church.

Holstein, Ontario Knox Presbyterian Church

A log church (Reid's Church) was erected in 1862. In 1869, the name was changed to Holstein Presbyterian Church and the congregation were linked in a three point charge with Amos and Fairbairn. The first minister of this three point charge was the Rev. Hugh Crozier. In 1877, Amos was separated from the charge. A new church building was dedicated in December of 1884 and the name Knox came into use. During the time of Church Union in 1925, Knox chose not to enter the United Church of Canada. In 1957, the tie between Holstein and Fairbairn was ended and Holstein was supplied from Amos. In 1961, Knox, Holstein was united in a three point charge with Knox, Normanby and Amos, Dromore.

Hornby Presbyterian Church, Hornby was formed in the 1830s as a congregation of the Presbyterian Church of Canada in connection with the Church of Scotland, and was linked with Trafalger for some years. In 1882 Hornby was linked with Omagh and in 1925 both congregations were linked with Boston Presbyterian Church, Esquesing in a three-point charge. In 1930 Hornby was designated a mission field and put under the care of Knox Presbyterian Church, Milton, with which it amalgamated in 1971.

Hornings Mills, Ontario Knox Presbyterian Church

Historical Sketch

Knox Presbyterian Church (Hornings Mills, Ont.) was organized in 1872 the Rev. W. M. Christie. The new congregation bought the Methodist Episcopal Church in February of 1878. The first minister to be inducted to Knox was the Rev. J. A. McDonald who began his ministry in 1883. At this time Knox, Hornings Mills was linked in a two point charge with Honeywood. The tie lasted until 1888 when Hornings Mills was linked with Primrose. A new church was built and dedicated September 21, 1913. The congregation remained with The Presbyterian Church in Canada during the time of Church Union in 1925. In 1933, Hornings Mills was briefly linked with Maple Valley. By 1938, Hornings Mills was again a single point charge.

This new building was named Cushman Memorial Presbyterian Church after elder Sturgis Salmon Cushman who had been instrumental in financing the new building. Cushman Memorial amalgamated with St. Giles Presbyterian Church (Ottawa, Ont.) in 1995.

Humber Heights, Ontario St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church

Huntingdon, Quebec St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church

Historical Sketch

St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church (Huntingdon, Quebec) was established in 1834. The first minister to be inducted was the Rev. William Montgomery Walker. In 1846, some members of the Athelstan congregation, along with some from the congregation in Huntingdon, split to form a new church as part of the United Presbyterian Church of Canada. This congregation, which became known as the Second Presbyterian Church, Huntingdon, it merged with St. Andrew's Church, Huntingdon, on June 7th, 1894. A new church building was dedicated in June of 1906. During the time of Church Union in 1925, St. Andrew's chose to remain with The Presbyterian Church in Canada. Around 1947, the Dewittville congregation amalgamated with St. Andrew's. Dundee amalgamated on June 15, 1954.
