

Presbyterian College Records

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Introduction

This collection consists of approximately 4 metres of records generated by Presbyterian College - one of the theological colleges funded and operated by the Presbyterian Church in Canada. The records consist of correspondence, minutes of committees, boards and senate, reports, financial records, and orders of service. These records were generated in the course of the general administration and management of the College. The collection also contains records concerning the work of the faculty including the minutes of faculty meetings. Also included in the collection are records reflecting the activities of the student body such as the student societies, and two scrapbooks of newspaper clippings compiled by Presbyterian College during the discussions on Church Union in the 1920's. The records cover the period from approximately 1866 to 1976. The bulk of the material, however, focuses on the years between 1930 and 1968.

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Historical Sketch

Presbyterian College, Montreal was originally proposed in January, 1864 in a meeting which took place at Terrace Bank, home of John Redpath. The meeting was attended by two Montreal clergymen, D.H. MacVicar and A.F. Kemp and seven prominent Montreal laymen. The initiative was taken at this meeting to recommend the foundation of a protestant theological college to serve the needs of Quebec and Eastern Canada. Founded by the Synod of the Canada Presbyterian Church, the new College responded to the claims that Knox College in Toronto was not educating a sufficient number of students to satisfy the ministerial demands. Montreal was considered the optimum location for such an institution as it could attract men from both Quebec and the Ottawa district. It was purported that a prominent Protestant theological college would be able to counteract the "dominant power of Popery, with all ignorance and superstition which it entails, as well as against many other adverse influences hurtful to a sound and pure Protestantism." [H.K. Markell p.2] In attendance at this first meeting was William Dawson, Principal of McGill University.

At a subsequent meeting, it was resolved "to ask the Presbytery of Montreal to overture the forthcoming Synod of the Canada Presbyterian Church for permission to establish a college in Montreal." [Markell pg 9] This was duly submitted in June of 1864 and the Synod recommended that the Presbytery of Montreal proceed with an application for a charter. The charter was granted in 1865 and the Act of Incorporation was passed by legislature the same year. The Synod, however, recommended that the opening of the College be delayed for a year, in order that the Presbytery might raise the necessary funds for the project. When the Presbytery returned to the Synod in 1867 with pledges totalling over \$20,000, the Synod commended the Presbytery, which was "exhorted to continue its efforts until the endowment fund had reached a minimum of \$30,000." [Markell pg. 10] Despite this recommendation, and despite the fact that no provision for a building had been made, the Synod agreed to allow the first classes to begin in the fall of 1867. These were held in the basement of Erskine Presbyterian Church in Montreal, with Rev. William Gregg of Cooke's Presbyterian Church in Toronto handling the teaching duties in the first term and Rev. William Aiken of Smith Falls assuming the responsibilities in the second term.

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On October 2, 1867, in the basement of Erskine Church, Rev. Gregg delivered the inaugural address to ten young students. As a demonstration of its support for Presbyterian College, Knox College donated several hundred books to establish the nucleus of a library. That fall, Presbyterian College was officially affiliated with McGill University. Despite the successes experienced by the College that fall, the College Board laboured to locate a suitable professor to assume the teaching duties permanently. In June of 1868, a motion was forwarded to nominate Rev. Donald MacVicar of Cote St. Presbyterian Church to the position of professor. In spite of the reluctance of a couple of the Board's members, Rev. MacVicar was inducted as Presbyterian College's first permanent professor on October 7, 1868.

During the early years of the College's development, its purpose remained unchanged. It was still expected that Presbyterian College halt the swell of Roman Catholicism in Eastern Canada, and promote Protestantism, particularly in Quebec. The College was determined to "furnish facilities to students to prepare themselves thoroughly for the peculiar service required in the Province of Quebec." [Markell pg. 13.] In order to help the College fulfill this aim, Rev. Daniel Coussirat was appointed French Lecturer in Theology to meet the needs of French speaking Presbyterians. In 1873, Rev. John Campbell joined the faculty from Charles St. Church in Toronto as Professor of Church History and Apologetics. With the teaching staff beginning to swell, General Assembly of the Canada Presbyterian Church appointed Professor MacVicar the first Principal of Presbyterian College. Moreover, as the space requirement of the College began to exceed the limitations of the basement facilities provided at Erskine Church, the Board met to consider more permanent arrangements.

On May 12, 1891, the Board met to discuss the possible purchase of a building for the College. Following an extensive search for a facility which would satisfy their needs, the Board determined at a meeting in March of 1872 that the College would have to construct its own building. Subsequently, a lot was purchased on McTavish St. adjoining McGill University. Work was begun in 1872 and Presbyterian College opened its own building on October, 28, 1873. The College, however, was experiencing tremendous growth and by 1880 it was apparent that expanded facilities would soon be required. Construction soon began on an extension to the existing building. The building was financed entirely by David Morrice and was named David Morrice Hall in his honour.

From its infancy, Presbyterian College had a close affiliation with McGill University. William Dawson, Principal of McGill University was at the first meeting to discuss the future of a theological college in Montreal. At this gathering, Principal Dawson first suggested a formal arrangement between the two institutions. Presbyterian College gleaned a number of advantages from this connection, particularly at its inception. Among these advantages were: 1) access to McGill's library, museum and lectures, 2) eligibility for scholarship and medals 3) permission to substitute Hebrew for a modern language course in the 1st and 2nd years of the Arts programme. 4) exemption from: Astronomy, Optics, Experimental Physics and Rhetoric in the 3rd year and from Experimental Physics and English Literature in the fourth year. In return for these favourable conditions, Presbyterian College officially acknowledged the opportunities offered at McGill and, in its Calendars, counselled "parents to send their sons to it [McGill] whether they are designed for the Christian ministry or for any other learned profession..." [Markell p. 78]

Over the course of time, the extremely formal affiliation established at the College's foundation gradually relaxed. The provisions on course exemptions, which had been so carefully detailed in 1872, became increasingly nebulous as the years passed. By the 1880's the exemption eligibility became less specific and the students were afforded more freedom of choice. By the turn of the

century, the calendar for Presbyterian College was even less specific about its relationship with McGill. The 1901 calendar "contained no reference to exemptions for theological students. Furthermore, the paragraph commending the University to prospective students had now been expunged." [Markell p. 79] As the time continued to pass, the formal connection between Presbyterian College and McGill University became less defined. Although Presbyterian College students continued to derive certain benefits from the historical relationship, such as health care benefits and use of recreational facilities, the affiliation was now reflected by nothing more than a note on Presbyterian College's letterhead. The affiliation, which had been arranged in 1872 but had lapsed by the 1930's, was reestablished in 1969. When Presbyterian College joined McGill's Faculty of Divinity, the old affiliation was supplanted with an outright association.

Presbyterian College opened in October of 1867 with ten students registered. From this humble beginning, Presbyterian College enjoyed a modest increase in cover the next three decades. Through the first years of the twentieth century, the College witnessed a slight reversal of this trend, culminating with the Act of Union in 1925. Although this initially had an adverse effect on the number of students registering at Presbyterian College, by the 1930's the effect had been reversed. As a result of the loss of other theological training centres to the United Church, increased through the 1930's and the first half of the 1940's. After the Second World War through to 1970, Presbyterian College experienced a pattern of decreases, oscillating "between leanness and emaciation. [Markell pg 52] It was under these disconcerting conditions that the decision was made to approach McGill University concerning a formal association between the two institutions.

During this period of disheartening conditions, Presbyterian College was headed by Principal Robert Lennox. Principal Lennox was appointed to the Chair of Old Testament Literature and Exegesis for Presbyterian College in 1945. Within two years, however, he was given the added responsibilities of Principal of the College. Principal from 1947 to 1967, Lennox oversaw numerous changes at the College. During his term, he witnessed a complete change over of faculty. The changes included: the sale of the old Presbyterian College building and the erection of a new facility on the east side of McGill's campus and the incorporation of Presbyterian College into the Faculty of Divinity at McGill. Under Principal Lennox's guidance, the Presbyterian Church in Canada was convinced of the benefits which would be derived from the assimilation of Presbyterian College and McGill's Faculty of Divinity.

Scope and Contents Note

This collection consists of the records of Presbyterian College and its extent is approximately 4 metres. The collection consists of four different fonds: a) General administrative records, 2) Professors/Faculty, c) Students, d) Church Union scrapbooks. Of the 29 document boxes making up the collection, 19 document boxes contain records of a general administrative nature. These records concern the general operation of the College reflected by the files of the Board of Management, the Senate and the Principal's office. These records consist of correspondence, minutes, reports, financial statements, orders of services and calendars. Material concerning the work and routine of the faculty is contained in 6 document boxes. The files contain the records concerning nomination and appointment of faculty members, correspondence of faculty members with the College Principal, inaugural addresses, minutes and reports of faculty meetings. Files reflecting student activities and, in particular, the work of the Presbyterian College Students' Society make up approximately 5 document boxes. Also included in this collection are two scrapbooks of newspaper clippings compiled by Presbyterian College during the discussions on Church Union in the 1920's. This fond makes up one document box. The records cover the period from approximately 1866 to 1976. The bulk of the material, however, focuses on the years between 1930 and 1968.

Presbyterian College Records

The records arrived at the Presbyterian Archives in April 1984 from Presbyterian College in Montreal, Quebec. Until their delivery to this Archives, the records had been stored in the vault of the College library. The contents of the files were very complete, and, therefore, some broad record series were easily identified. The original filing system, however, had been disrupted over the years and, thus, the exact filing order was not readily apparent. Consequently, the arrangement of the records into the fonds explained above was imposed the archivist; yet, all the original file titles and their contents have been preserved.

All non-archival material was culled from the collection. In addition, a small amount of material concerning Presbyterian congregations, the personal papers of other ministers, and periodicals from the College were removed from this collection and relected in the appropriate collection.
