Darlington, Ontario

St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church

Historical Sketch

St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church, Darlington was organized in 1842 with the assistance from the Colonial Committee of the Church of Scotland. In 1844, five of the nine Trustees entered the Presbyterian Church of Canada whereupon ownership of the church building was disputed. In 1845 the Court of the Queen's Bench awarded the building to the congregation in connection with the Church of Scotland. Thereafter the congregation met in a church in Bowmanville, Ontario. After a vacancy of some years, St. Andrew's Darlington appears to have been closed in 1889/1889.

Demorestville, Ontario

Demorestville Presbyterian Church

Historical Sketch

Demorestville Presbyterian Church (later called Knox Presbyterian Church), Demorestville, Prince Edward County, Ont. was organized in 1830. The congregation was part of the Presbyterian Church of Canada in connection with the Church of Scotland and their first minister was Rev. Robert McDowell. It is unclear how long Rev. McDowell served, but there is mention of the Rev. James Rogers serving the Demorestville congregation as well as the congregations of St. Andrew's Picton and Hillier, before he was inducted as minister of Demorestville in 1838.

Land was given in 1830 by Mr. Demorest, founder of the Village, and a church was completed in 1832. The Disruption in the Church of Scotland in 1843 resulted in the congregation and their minister, Rev. Rogers, joining the Free Church of the Presbyterian Church of Canada in 1844. In the years following, the congregation struggled. There were years where few services were held; several ministers served, but there were many years until the congregation was dissolved in 1929, when the church was supplied by student ministers. In 1909 the old church was pulled down and a new church was built on the site.

A congregation known as Union Church was mentioned in Knox's records. There are minutes of a meeting of the elders and trustees of Union in 1841. As well Union was represented at a Knox congregational meeting in 1887 to engage an Ordained Missionary to serve Union and Knox and to raise funds for this through subscriptions from Union members. There were also members of the Knox Session who were from Union Church, leading one to conclude that Union and Knox had a joint Session, sharing in stipend costs and raising money individually to maintain their church buildings. The Union Church, or Black's Church, was located on Back Road in the Village of Demorestville.

In 1925 the congregation voted to remain within The Presbyterian Church in Canada, but later that year, the congregation decided to close the church "on account of impoverishment". In December 1929, the congregation petitioned Presbytery to dissolve and permission for this was formally given March 5, 1929.

In 1887, it was linked with Knox, Iroquois and in 1960 the congregation was amalgamated with Knox, Iroquois and the church building was sold.

Dixonville, Alberta Strang Presbyterian Church

Historical Sketch

Strang Presbyterian Church in Dixonville, Alberta was formed in 1932 by The Rev. Dr. Margaret Strang. Prior to Dr. Strang's arrival, the Presbyterians in the area were served by student ministers during the summer months. A church building was erected in 1932.

Historical Sketch

St. James Presbyterian in Dorchester was established in 1880 by the Rev. Joseph Hogg of Moncton, N.B. The congregation initially worshipped in Robb Hall, but had built a church by 1885. By 1926, they were linked with St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church in Sackville as a two-point charge, and in 1939, with St. James, Port Elgin, as a three-point charge. In 1968, the church closed its doors and amalgamated with St. Andrew's in Sackville.

Dresden, Ontario

St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church

Historical Sketch

St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church, Dresden began in 1872 as a Mission Station under the charge of Mr. G.G. McRobbie, a student minister and Gilbert Tweedie, M.D. a medical doctor and lay preacher. In 1876 the congregation erected a church building in North Dresden. In 1879 the Dresden church was united with Knox, Chatham Township as a two point charge. The first ordained minister was the Rev. Thomas Tallach, inducted in 1881 who served until his death in 1890. In winter of 1895 several years of planning culminated with the church building being moved across the river ice to a new location "next to the Fire Hall" in Dresden. In 1925 the congregation voted unanimously to remain with the Presbyterian Church in Canada. A church hall was completed in 1927. The congregation changed its name from Knox to St. Andrew's in 1963.

Amos Presbyterian Church

Historical Sketch

Amos Presbyterian Church in Dromore, Ontario was founded in the mid-1800s. A church building was constructed in 1864 on property donated by Mr. and Mrs. George and Margaret Amos. The first minister called to the church was the Rev. H. Crozier. Prior to 1878 the congregation was linked with the congregations in Fairbairn and Holstein as a three-point charge. After 1878 it was linked with Knox Presbyterian Church, Normanby in a two-point charge. In 1962, the two congregations were once again linked with Holstein in a three-point charge. The original church was replaced with a brick building in 1884.

Dundas, Ontario

Knox Presbyterian Church

Historical Sketch

Knox Presbyterian Church, Dundas, was formed in 1844 by the division of the St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church, Dundas, as a result of the Disruption of the Church of Scotland and the formation of the Presbyterian Church of Canada. Its first minister was the Rev. Mark Young Stark who was also the first Moderator of the Presbyterian Church of Canada. Knox was linked with the congregation at Ancaster until 1854. In the 1870s, with the union of the various Presbyterian churches, Knox and St. Andrew's were also re-united and the enlarged congregation retained the name of Knox.

Note

The Marriage Registers were maintained by individual ministers in various charges and include marriages at Cobourg, 1860-1871, at Port Arthur, Fort William, Prince Arthur's Landing and Pigeon River 1881-1885, and at Medicine Hat, 1886-1869.

Knox Presbyterian Church

Historical Sketch

Knox Presbyterian Church in Dunnville, Ontario, traces its origins to 1833, when the Presbyterians in the area began to meet together for worship. In 1834, they were organized under the Niagara Presbytery of the American Presbyterian Church. By 1835, however, the congregation had joined the Presbytery of Hamilton within the Presbyterian Church in Canada. In 1845, property at Lot 19 on the north side of Lock Street was purchased and a church building was constructed soon after. This building was replaced in 1906/07 and the new church was formally dedicated on September 27, 1907. The congregation voted to remain within The Presbyterian Church in Canada at the time of Church Union in 1925.

Dunvegan, Ontario Kenyon Presbyterian Church

Historical Sketch

The congregation of Kenyon Presbyterian Church in Dunvegan, Ontario dates from 1838, when The Rev. Daniel Clark was appointed as minister to the area. In 1840, a log church was constructed by the congregation. After Clark's retirement in 1849, the pulpit was vacant until 1853, when The Rev. Daniel Gordon arrived. Kenyon Church was joined with the congregations in Indian Lands and Roxboro from 1853 to 1856, when Kenyon was separated and established as a distinct charge. As the congregation grew, it was decided to build a larger church. Construction was begun in 1872, but the formal opening wasn't until September 9, 1880. At the time of Church Union in 1925, the congregation voted to remain within The Presbyterian Church in Canada.

Historical Sketch

Durham Presbyterian Church was formed in 1925 when the majority of the congregation of Knox Presbyterian Church (Durham, ON) entered the United Church of Canada. The minority (45%) formed Durham Presbyterian Church, calling the Rev. B.D. Armstrong in 1925. They completed new brick church in 1927 having bought all the contents from Guthrie Presbyterian Church in Harriston. The church was refurbished in 1957 and in 1974 a two-story addition for Sunday school and the church office was completed.
