Walkerton, Ontario Knox Presbyterian Church

Historical Sketch

Knox Presbyterian Church in Walkerton, Ontario was formed in 1886 from the amalgamation of Free St. John's Church and St. Paul's Church, both in the Walkerton area. Free St. John's Presbyterian Church was established in 1851 within the United Presbyterian Church, while St. Paul's Presbyterian Church was established in 1873 within the Presbyterian Church in Canada in Connection with the Church of Scotland. Both became part of The Presbyterian Church in Canada in 1875, and their desire to amalgamate was approved in 1886. The amalgamated congregation took the name Knox Presbyterian Church and continued to worship out of the Free St. John's building. The St. Paul's building was sold to the Methodists. In 1925, the congregation voted to remain within The Presbyterian Church in Canada.

Wallaceburg, Ontario Knox Presbyterian Church

Historical Sketch

Knox Presbyterian Church (Wallaceburg, Ont.) was established in 1854 when the first church building was opened and dedicated. The congregation was operated as a mission until 1879 when they inducted their first minister, the Rev. D. McKerracher. In 1881 the building was moved to a new location on Duncan St., it was unfortunately destroyed by fire in 1889. A new church building was opened and dedicated in March of 1901. The congregation of Knox Presbyterian chose to remain with The Presbyterian Church in Canada in 1925. However, their minister the Rev. M. C. Tait chose to enter Union.

Chalmers Presbyterian Church in Walpole, Ontario was founded in the mid-1800s. The first minister to the area was The Rev. William Bethune, who resided on the tenth concession. After his retirement, The Rev. John McRobie was inducted into the charge, in 1857. A church building was constructed over several years and opened in 1863.

Warkworth, Ontario

St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church

Historical Sketch

St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church in Warkworth, Ontario dates from 1840, when Rev. William Reid of Grafton and Colborne visited and ministered to the Presbyterians in the area around Warkworth (Percy Township). Shortly after they were organized into a congregation by the Presbytery of Cobourg within the "Free" Presbyterian Church of Canada. From 1858 to 1864, the congregation (known at that time as the Percy Congregation) was joined with the congregation in Seymour. In 1865 they opened a new church building. From 1872 until 1884, they were linked with the congregation in Campbellford. During 1893 and early 1894, the church was enlarged and rebuilt. At the time of Church Union in 1925, the congregation voted to remain within The Presbyterian Church in Canada. In 1947, St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church, Warkworth was linked with St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church, Hastings as a two-point charge.

Warwick, Ontario Knox Presbyterian Church

Historical Sketch

The congregation of Knox Presbyterian Church in Warwick Township, Ontario was formed c.1854, when members gathered for worship in the school house located on the 4th concession near Watford. Other Presbyterians gathered for worship in a Congregational Chapel on the Main Road. Both groups appear to have been served by the same minister, who lived in a manse in Warwick Village. A church building was constructed in 1869 and officially opened on the first Sunday of 1870. At the time of Church Union in 1925, the congregation voted to remain within The Presbyterian Church in Canada. The congregation was dissolved on November 16, 1983.

Washago Presbyterian Church

Historical Sketch

Washago Presbyterian Church was established in 1874 as a mission station of the Presbyterian Church of Canada in connection with the Church of Scotland. In 1878 it was linked with Gravenhurst and Severn Bridge to form a three-point charge. In 1882 Washago was linked with Ardtrea and Severn Bridge, and reverted to being a mission station. In 1886 it was served by an ordained minister and reverted again to a student mission station in 1888. In 1909 it was erected as an augmented charge.

Waterdown, Ontario Knox Presbyterian Church

Historical Sketch

Knox Presbyterian Church (Waterdown, Ont.) was established in 1830 under the direction of the Rev. William King. A church building was constructed at this time. Rev. King also organized the congregation at Nelson and the two congregations were united as a joint charge under the Church of Scotland. During the Disruption, a new Presbyterian congregation was formed in Waterdown as a part of the Free Church. This congregation was called Knox. In 1846, a new frame church was built and the Church of Scotland congregation took on the name St. Andrew's. In 1874, the Presbyterian denominations united and St. Andrew's and Knox became one congregation under the name Knox. During the time of Church Union in 1925, Knox, Waterdown chose not to join the United Church but to remain a part of The Presbyterian Church in Canada. In 1980, the congregation of Knox had grown sufficiently that it was able to become a self sustaining one point charge. Thus, the longstanding unity with the church at Nelson was ended.

Historical Sketch

Knox Presbyterian Church (Waterloo, Ont.) was established in 1925 following Church Union. The congregation was formed by the non-concurring Presbyterians of St. Paul's Presbyterian Church (est. 1888). The first minister was the Rev. W. G. Richardson. A new church building was built in 1927 and it was at this time that the congregation took on the name Knox. The church building was extended in 1958.

St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church was established in 1925 when the original St. Andrew's congregation entered the United Church of Canada and the non-concurring Presbyterians continued as Watford Presbyterian Church. In 1940 Watford was linked with Knox, Warwick and Thedford Presbyterian Church, Thedford. In 1961, St. Andrew's United Church was closed and the building sold to Watford Presbyterian Church. The congregation was then re-named St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church.

Crowland Presbyterian Church

Historical Sketch

Crowland Presbyterian Church (Welland, Ont.) was established in 1834 under the direction of the Rev. Angus McIntosh. The congregation met in the local school house until a church building was completed in 1858. A new building was constructed in 1896 and relocated in 1960. Throughout its history, Crowland has been joined with many different congregations. In 1908, Crowland was joined with Port Robinson. In 1918, the congregation ceased to be a mission station and became a regular ordained charge. In 1928, the congregation was united with Chippawa until 1940. In 1958, the congregation united with St. Davids until uniting with Knox, Welland in 1960. 1966 saw the congregation become part of a three point charge with Kirk On-the-Hill, and Knox. In 1974, Crowland joined with St. Andrew's, Merriton. Finally, in 1976 Crowland was joined with Welland Hungarian Presbyterian Church.

St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church, Welland, was established as a mission station of the Canada Presbyterian Church in 1862 and was erected as a congregation in 1879. In 1872, the Rev. Hancock was the first minister to be inducted. A new church building was constructed and opened on January 5, 1890. The congregation became self supporting in 1907. St. Andrew's chose not to enter Church Union in 1925.

Wellandport, Ontario

Wellandport Presbyterian Church

Historical Sketch

Wellandport Presbyterian Church was organized in 1831 and called Chippewa Presbyterian Church, under the jurisdiction of the Presbytery of Niagara in connection with the American Presbyterian Church. Around 1845 the congregation of Wellandport entered the Presbyterian Church of Canada in connection with the Church of Scotland as part of a joint charge with Dunnville. In 1865 the link with Dunnville was dissolved and Wellandport was linked with St. Ann's until 1883. In 1904 Wellandport was again linked with St. Ann's. There were some difficulties with this union in the 1920s and between 1923 and 1925 Wellandport was without regular services. In 1925 Wellandport voted to remain in the Presbyterian Church in Canada while St. Ann's entered the United Church of Canada. Wellandport was then linked with the continuing Presbyterian congregation at Smithville until 1943 when both Smithville and Wellandport were linked with St. Andrew's, Beamsville. In 1945 Wellandport was linked with Dunnville and in 1947 the congregation was closed.

West Brant Presbyterian Church was founded in 1868 as a pastoral charge linked with the church in North Brant (Malcolm). A stone church building was constructed c.1869. By 1878, the link with North Brant was dissolved and the West Branch church was joined with Pinkerton. Membership in the West Brant Church dwindled in the early 1900s and the church was closed in 1909.

West Flamborough, Ontario

West Flamborough Presbyterian Church

Historical Sketch

The congregation of West Flamborough Presbyterian Church in West Flamborough, Ontario dates from 1832, when the Rev. Thomas Christie, a minister with the United Associate Synod of the Secession Church of Scotland, arrived to the area from Orkney, Scotland. He soon established a congregation and by 1833 a church building had been constructed. He served as minister to the congregation for many years before passing away in 1870. In 1866, a new stone church was built to replace the original frame building. A manse was constructed in 1867. In December 1883, the West Flamborough church was joined (with one Kirk Session) with the church in Lynden. This relationship continued until the two were separated in 1905. In 1925, the congregation voted to remain within The Presbyterian Church in Canada, and was linked as a two-point charge with the church in Kirkwall. In 1930, the congregation in Sheffield was added to the charge. In 1955, these links were dissolved and West Flamborough continued as a one-point charge.

[Note: From the mid-1820s, ministers of the Presbyterian Church of Canada in Connection with the Church of Scotland (Rev. George Sheed and later Rev. Mark Y. Stark) had served the area, establishing the Presbyterian Congregation of West Flamboro and Ancaster (this congregation was the fore-runner of St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church in Ancaster, Ontario; see the entry for that congregation for a listing of records available)].

Historical Sketch

Wilton Presbyterian Church was established as a mission station of the Canada Presbyterian Church during the 1870s and was linked with Glenvale and Harrowsmith until 1919, when Harrowsmith was dissolved, and with Glenvale alone until 1925. In 1925, Wilton and Glenvale were linked with Ernestown and Camden East in a four-point charge. Between 1936 and 1941 there were several re-alignments of congregations in the area. In 1936 Deseronto, Camden East, Wilton, Glenvale, Ernestown and Sunbury were linked as one pastoral charge. In 1937 Deseronto and Sunbury were set up as a two-point charge and the other four were designated mission stations with student supply. In 1938 Deseronto, Camden East and Ernestown were linked as a three-point charge, while Wilton, Glenvale and Sunbury were linked as a three-point charge. In 1940, Sunbury, Glenvale and Wilton were placed as student mission fields under Deseronto and in 1941 Wilton was dissolved.

St. Paul's Presbyterian Church in Winchester, Ontario was established as a mission station in 1857. Construction on a church building was begun in 1858, but not completed until 1860. It was a frame building and was known as "The White Church". In 1864, its status was elevated from that of a mission station to a full congregation. At that time, the Rev. William Bennet was called to serve as minister. By the 1890s the frame church was too small, and it was decided to sell it and construct a larger, brick church. The new church was opened and dedicated on June 2, 1895. At the time of Church Union, the congregation voted to remain part of The Presbyterian Church in Canada. The 100th anniversary of the church was celebrated on June 16, 1957. During the year extensive renovations to the church building were carried out.

Historical Sketch

Knox Presbyterian Church in Windsor, Ontario was organized as a congregation by the Presbytery of Chatham within The Presbyterian Church in Canada, in 1920. The congregation originated as a branch Sunday School established by St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church in Windsor in 1908. Property was purchased on the south-west corner of McEwan and London and in 1910 a building was constructed. In 1919, regular worship services were held as well. By this time, however, the building was becoming too small. Property across the street was therefore purchased, where a basement was dug, and the building was moved across the street and over this basement. In 1925, the congregation voted against Church Union and decided to remain a part of The Presbyterian Church in Canada. From 1935 to 1953, Knox was linked with St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church in Amherstburg as a two-point charge. Lots for a new church were purchased in 1951 at the corner of Wyandotte and Askin, and the new church building was dedicated June 23, 1957.

Historical Sketch

Wingham Presbyterian Church was organized as a congregation in 1862 by the Rev. W. C. Young from the Presbytery of Huron. The congregation met for worship in school houses, barns and other convenient buildings until land was acquired in 1866 and a frame church was completed in 1867. A union session, representing congregations from Wingham, Bluevale and Eadie's, was formed in 1866 and the Rev. James Hastie was inducted as minister serving the three congregations until 1871. An addition was added to the church a few years later as the congregation grew. In 1876, the three-point charge was dissolved and Wingham called their own minister, the Rev. James Pritchard. In 1881 Wingham Presbyterian Church was destroyed by fire and a new brick church was completed the following year on another site more central within the growing town of Wingham. About 1895 the congregation adopted the name "St. Andrew's". In 1925 the congregation voted to remain within the Presbyterian Church and the following year, St. Andrew's Wingham and the congregation of Belgrave were made a two-point charge. This arrangement continued until 1933 when St. Andrew's Wingham once again became a single charge.

Kildonan Presbyterian Church

Historical Sketch

Kildonan Presbyterian Church in Winnipeg, Ontario was founded in 1851 when the Rev. John Black arrived as minister to the Presbyterian settlers of Lord Selkirk's Red River Settlement. He conducted his first service (the first service conducted by an ordained Presbyterian minister west of the Great Lakes) on September 28th, 1851. The settlers had built a manse for Rev. Black in early 1851. Construction on a church was begun soon after, however, the flood of 1852 delayed the building, and it wasn't until January 1854 that the new church was opened. Mission work to surrounding areas was conducted and by 1862, another missionary, the Rev. James Nisbet, was sent to the area to assist Rev. Black. Rev. Nisbet helped raise funds for the construction of a church school in 1864. In 1866, Rev. Nisbet moved on to further mission work in the west. Rev. Black served the congregation until his death in 1882.

Winterbourne, Ontario Chalmers Presbyterian Church

Historical Sketch

Presbyterians in Winterbourne (Woolwich ON) met for worship as early as 1829. The congregation gathered in houses, a nearby hotel and in a log school house until they could erect a church building in 1837. The congregation's first minister was the Rev. Alexander Ross who had been sent to Canada by the Glasgow Society and had settled in Woolwich in 1841. The Disruption of 1844 caused a split in the "Auld Kirk" congregation.

The group choosing to join the Free Church, known as Chalmers' Church, after worshipping in the school house and sharing space in the Auld Kirk, built the Lecture Room in 1848, located behind the present Chalmers' Church. They had no minister and services were conducted by Knox students and the session. In 1856 and 1857 a Rev. A. Constable Geikee preached to the congregations of Chalmers' and Berlin, however, this arrangement ceased when efforts failed upon his formal call as minister. The Rev. George Cuthbertson was inducted as Chalmers' first minister in 1857 serving until 1862. In 1862, part of the congregation left to form a separate Elmira congregation.

The part of the original congregation choosing to continue under the Church of Scotland were led by the Rev. James Shour from 1854 to 1867 and were known as St. Andrew's, Woolwich, A stone manse was purchased in 1854.

In 1876, Chalmers' and St. Andrew's were formally re-united as one church, continuing under the name of Chalmers', with the Rev. A.M. Hamilton serving as minister from 1877 to 1917. In 1925 Chalmers' voted to remain within the Presbyterian Church.

Historical Sketch

Knox Presbyterian Church (Woodstock, Ont.) was organized in 1838 by the Rev. Alexander Gale as a part of the Church of Scotland. The first minister was the Rev. Daniel Allen who served the joint charge of Woodstock and Stratford until 1840 when he chose to serve Stratford alone. A church building was finished in 1842 and named St. Andrew's. During the Disruption, St. Andrew's remained with the Church of Scotland and a majority of the congregation chose to join the Free Church. A new church building was completed in 1850 and named Knox. The first minister of Knox the Free Church congregation, was the Rev. William Servos Ball. St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church united with Knox Church in 1865. A new church building was finished in 1897. Knox Presbyterian Church chose to remain with The Presbyterian Church in Canada during the time of Church Union in 1925.

Woodstock, New Brunswick

St. Paul's Presbyterian Church

Historical Sketch

St. Paul's Presbyterian Church in Woodstock, New Brunswick was formed in 1867. However, the congregation appears to have origins several decades earlier when a church was built by Presbyterians in the village of Upper Woodstock. This early church, called St. Andrew's, was built in 1838 and appears to have been linked with the Presbyterian church in Richmond, N.B., sharing a minister. For some reason, it was decided in 1867 that a new church in the town of Woodstock (incorporated in 1856) would be built and the old church was abandoned. The new church took several years to construct and was finally dedicated in 1872. At the time of Church Union in 1925, the congregation voted to remain within The Presbyterian Church in Canada. During the pastorate of Rev. Robert Ross, 1966-1977, a new manse was constructed and a Christian Education wing was added to the church.

Note: the church in Richmond appears to have become a United Church in 1925.

Woodville Community Presbyterian Church

Historical Sketch

Woodville Community Presbyterian Church (Ont.) was officially organized in 1848 as a part of the Presbyterian Church of Canada. The congregation is first called Eldon and Mariposa. The congregation was a united charge (three point) with Eldon and Thorah. The Rev. John McTavish was the first minister and was inducted July 27, 1854. Woodville was a two point charge with Beaverton until 1861 when Woodville became a separate charge and from then had occasional union with Fenelon. In 1936 Woodville became a 2 pt. charge with Eldon. In 1937, the name changed to Knox Presbyterian Church (Woodville, Ont.). At the end of 1995, St. Andrew's, South Eldon closed its doors. January 1, 1996 saw them amalgamated with Knox, Woodville. At the same time they took on a new name "Woodville Community Presbyterian Church".

Historical Sketch

St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church (Wyoming, Ont.) was established in 1866. The first minister was the Rev. Walter M Roger. From the beginning of its existence, St. Andrew's was a joint charge with Petrolia, this union was dissolved in 1871. A church building was opened in 1869. In 1875, St. Andrew's was united with South Plympton. This union lasted until 1925, when St. Andrew's joined with St. John's, Aberarder. In May 1930 a new church building was opened.
