Margaret Rodger Memorial Presbyterian Church (Lachute, Quebec) was established in 1925. The congregation was initially known as Lachute Presbyterian Church however, the name was changed in 1932 following the construction of a new church building. The first minister was the Rev. Henry Cousens who was inducted shortly after the establishment of the congregation.

Historical Sketch

St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church (Lake Megantic, Quebec) was established in 1925 by non-concurring Presbyterians. The congregation was serviced by student ministers, visiting ministers and the Synodical Missionary Rev. Allan S. Reid. The first inducted minister may have been the Rev. Hugh L. Nugent who was inducted around 1958. St. Andrew's amalgamated with St. Paul's, Scotstown in 1980.

Lancaster, Ontario

St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church

Historical Sketch

St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church, Lancaster (also known as St. Andrew's, South Lancaster and as St. Andrew's, Kirktown) began with services from about 1787, conducted by the Church of Scotland's Rev. John Bethune. The church in Lancaster was originally part of a pastoral charge of four churches established by Bethune - the other three were in Summerstown, Martintown and Cornwall. Bethune served these congregations until his death in 1815.

The St. Andrew's congregation changed its status from a mission station and was established as a separate congregation in 1822. Supply ministers served until 1834 when a second congregation was established on the Second Concession, Lancaster Township and The Rev. Alexander McNaughton was called. He served these two congregations until 1842. In 1847 the "Disruption" caused some of St. Andrews' members to leave to form a Free Church congregation, later known as Zion. In 1875, the congregations of St. Andrew's and Second Concession voted to continue their connection with the Church of Scotland, deciding to join The Presbyterian Church in Canada only in 1898. In 1899, they were joined together with the Presbyterian church in Curry Hill to form a united congregation under the name "St. Andrew's, Lancaster" - one congregation with three church buildings. The nature of this relationship caused a fair bit of difficulty at the time of the Church Union vote in 1925. The outcome was not decided until 1926 when the Court ruled that: the "Old Stone Church" in Lancaster would remain Presbyterian, while the Curry Hill and the Second Concession churches would be part of the United Church of Canada. The "Old Stone Church" continued under the name of St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church, Lancaster. In 1970, Martintown formed a two point charge with St. Andrew's, Lancaster, an arrangement which continues to the present day. St. Andrew's Lancaster completed a frame church in 1790 and replaced this with a stone church in 1855 (afterwards being known as the "Stone Church"). A manse was built north of the Stone Church sometime between 1834 and 1842 and was used for many years until it was sold in 1969. A glebe of 200 acres "in the front concession" of Lancaster Township was granted in 1809 to provide income for the congregation as part of the Church of Scotland. At Union in 1925, St. Andrew's paid \$5,000 to the United Church of Canada in order to retain title to this land and the Manse. Land on the Second Concession, Lancaster was donated for a church and cemetery in 1827 and a the Second Concession church was built in 1834. A Christian Education Centre, built south east of the St. Andrew's Lancaster church and connected to it, was completed in 1967.

Historical Sketch

Langley Presbyterian Church was established in ?. In 1980, the church in Murrayville was amalgamated with Langley Presbyterian Church. Murrayville Presbyterian Church was established in 1925 by the non-concurring minority of Sharon Presbyterian Church, Murrayville. Sharon Presbyterian Church was originally established as Langley Prairie mission station in the 1890s and became part of a four-point charge. In the late 1950s, Beaver Presbyterian Church in Coghlan, B.C., was amalgamated with Murrayville Presbyterian Church.

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Largie, Ontario

Duff Presbyterian Church

Historical Sketch

Duff Presbyterian Church (Largie, Ont.) was established in the winter of 1851-1852 as a part of the Presbyterian Church of Canada. The congregation was made up of members from Wallacetown and the River Station (later called Largie). A church was built at Largie in 1855 and services were conducted in both English and Gaelic. The Rev. Archibald McDiarmid was the first minister to be inducted into the joint charge of Largie and Wallacetown. In 1875 following the Union of Presbyterian Churches, Wallacetown severed its connection with Largie. Largie then joined with Chalmers, Cowal. A new church building was completed and dedicated September 29, 1895. In 1900, Largie was separated from Cowal and united with Tait's Corners. During the time of Church Union in 1925, the congregation at Largie chose to remain with The Presbyterian Church in Canada. The congregation at Tait's Corners chose to enter Union and thus, the union between the two congregations was ended. Shortly after 1925, Largie was united with the congregation at Crinian.

Leamington, Ontario Knox Presbyterian Church

Historical Sketch

Knox Presbyterian Church (Leamington, Ont.) was established in 1876 in connection with the Blytheswood Field. A frame church was built in 1887. Leamington united with Blytheswood and Campbell's Settlement in 1880. Together, the congregations called the Rev. J. B. Scott as minister. Leamington became a self-sustaining congregation in 1889 and called their first minister the Rev. Murray Watson. The church building was destroyed by fire in 1891 and was reopened on February 28, 1892. During the time of Church Union in 1925, Knox, Leamington chose to remain a part of The Presbyterian Church in Canada. The congregation dissolved in 2022.

Historical Sketch

St. Paul's Presbyterian Church (Leaskdale, Ont.) was established in 1862. The first church building was completed in April of 1864. Leaskdale was united with Uxbridge from 1864 until 1880. After the congregation at Uxbridge separated from Leaskdale, St. Paul's was joined in a two point charge with the newly established preaching station at Zephyr. A new church building was completed in 1906. The congregation remained with The Presbyterian Church in Canada during the time of Church Union in 1925. The congregation at Zephyr fully amalgamated with St. Paul's in 1969.

St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church

Historical Sketch

St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church (Lindsay, Ont.) was established in 1835 when Presbyterian meetings associated with the Church of Scotland began in the region. A church building was opened in 1848. The first inducted minister was the Rev. Gilbert Tweedie. Following the Disruption, a new Presbyterian congregation was formed as a part of the Presbyterian Church of Canada (Free Church). This new congregation was known as the Peel St. Presbyterian Church. A fire destroyed much of Lindsay in 1861. The church of Scotland congregation lost its building and a new building was opened in 1864. This church was known as the Francis St. Presbyterian Church. In 1875, the two Presbyterian congregations were united under The Presbyterian Church in Canada. The building on Peel St. was sold and the new congregation became known as St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church. A new church building was completed and dedicated January 2, 1887 and the building on Francis St. was sold. The congregation of St. Andrew's voted to remain a part of The Presbyterian Church in Canada during the time of Church Union in 1925.

Knox Presbyterian Church (Listowel, Ont.) was established in 1857. The congregation initially shared the Congregationalists' building until 1868 when the first Presbyterian church was built. The Rev. Robert Renwick was the first minister to the four point charge of Monkton, Elma Centre, Molesworth and Listowel. In 1868, Monkton and Elma Centre were separated from Molesworth and Listowel. Listowel was separated from Molesworth in 1876. In 1888 a new church building was opened. The congregation of Knox, Listowel chose to remain a part of The Presbyterian Church in Canada during the time of Church Union in 1925.

Lloydminster, Alberta Knox Presbyterian Church

Historical Sketch

Knox Presbyterian Church (Lloydminster, AB) was organized in 1904 by a number of early settlers to the village of Lloydminster, Alberta. The group initially met in the Immigration Hall under the leadership of Mr. E. Morgan. An ordained minister was appointed in March of 1905. His name was the Rev. A. R. McLennan. A church building was dedicated on February 6, 1906. On November 6, 1911 the church was incorporated under the name of Knox Presbyterian Church and was declared self-supporting in May of 1916. Knox Presbyterian Church voted to remain with The Presbyterian Church in Canada in 1925. The congregation dissolved in 2021.

Elmwood Avenue Presbyterian Church (London, Ont.) was established in 1925 by the non-concurring Presbyterians from Knox Presbyterian Church (London, Ont.) (est. 1883). The first meeting of the new congregation was held on February 16, 1925 at Wortley Road School. The first services were held at Victoria School on March 22, 1925. The congregation decided to buy the Leys estate at 111 Elmwood Avenue. The Rev. F. W. Gilmour was the first minister to be inducted. In 1926, a new church building was constructed next to the existing estate building. The church was dedicated on October 27, 1926.

New St. James Presbyterian Church

Historical Sketch

New St. James Presbyterian Church, London (known first as St. James) was one congregation with St. Andrew's when it was established in 1833 under the Church of Scotland. The combined congregation's first minister was Rev. Miller who served from 1833 to 1836. Meetings were held in the Court House, in the Grammar School on King Street until a government land was given in 1842 for a church and cemetery. With the Disruption of 1843 in Scotland, a part of these congregations formed the Free Church and a part remained connected with the Church of Scotland continuing under the name St. James. No longer having property for a church, St. James was granted the gore on Richmond Street by the government in 1850 and a church was completed in 1861. Entry into the Union of 1875 was decided after considerable controversy and with the loss of half the congregation who wished to stay with the Church of Scotland. Again property was under dispute, however, St. James under the Presbyterian Church in Canada retained its church property and in 1890 added a Lecture and Sabbath School. It was decided to move the church further north and a site was purchased in 1899. A new church completed in 1900 and the congregation continued, being known as New St. James Presbyterian Church. The Richmond Street church was sold in 1900 along with St. Andrew's Mission Church (Oxford and Colborne Sts.) which had been donated to New St. James by St. Andrew's. A mission church was built (between 1906 and 1911) at Knollwood Park), a joint undertaking between New St. James and St. Andrew's. In 1917 a manse was purchased at 332 St. James Street. In 1925 two-thirds of the congregation voted to remain within the Presbyterian Church.

St. George's Presbyterian Church

Historical Sketch

St. George's Presbyterian Church, London began in 1888 with a prayer meeting in Pottersburg (originally London Junction), led by Rev. W. M. Roger, minister of King Street Presbyterian Church. From there, a Mission was organized under the auspices of King Street Presbyterian Church in 1889. That year a Mission Hall was built, however it was destroyed by fire in 1895. Responsibility for the Mission was transferred to St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church in 1895. In 1896 a new brick church was built and opened and in 1897, St. George's, Pottersburg was erected as a congregation. Their first minister was Rev. George Gilmore who served from 1897 until 1902. In 1925 the congregation voted substantially to remain within the Presbyterian Church. In 1929 a new church was built on Dundas Street (London East) and a Sunday school wing was added in 1931. The house adjacent (to the east) was bought and renovated in 1955 for the expanding Sunday school. In 1969, a new (present) church was built on Dundas Street East (1475). St. George's became a two-point charge with Dorchester in 1928 and this arrangement lasted until 1959 when St. George's continued on its own and Dorchester moved to be linked with South Nissouri.

Lucknow Presbyterian Church

Historical Sketch

Lucknow Presbyterian Church, began a little further away in Kinloss Township with services in log church built in 1856 on a hundred acre parcel of land on the Second Concession. The congregation was organized by Rev. Murdoch McKenzie of Zorra. A second church was erected in 1863 on a hill on the same parcel of land and the proceeds of the sale of the north half of the property went toward the cost of the new church. The Rev. John McNabb was ordained in 1867 as the first minister serving until 1869. Part of his congregation asked to form a congregation in the Village of Lucknow in 1873 under the Presbyterian Church in Canada in connection with the Church of Scotland. The congregation was known as St. Andrew's Church Lucknow and held services in the Temperance Hall until a stone church was built.

In 1872, South Kinloss Church's (Free Church) minister, Rev. Duncan Cameron began holding services in Lucknow for the Kinloss congregants living there. A frame church was built on Rose Street in 1873 and the congregation officially separated from Kinloss in 1881 to be called Knox Church. Now with two Presbyterian congregations in Lucknow, St. Andrew's and Knox, it was agreed in 1886, to unite these two congregations to form Lucknow Presbyterian Church. Their first minister was Rev. Angus McKay who served from 1886 to 1904. A new brick church was completed in 1890 and a brick manse was bought in 1906. In 1925 Lucknow voted to remain within the Presbyterian Church.

Lucknow and Erskine, Dungannon were linked in a two-point charge from 1925 to 1960 and fully amalgamated on March 31, 1973. In 1974, Lucknow was linked with South Kinloss in a two point charge and this has continued until the present.
