Historical Sketch

Bethel Presbyterian Church (Ilderton, Ont.) was organized in 1832 by the Rev. Thomas Christie. The first minister to be inducted was the Rev. William Proudfoot. The congregation began by meeting in homes and barns, shortly after their organization, they were able to build a church building. A newer building was built in 1839. Initially the congregation was known as Bethel Proof Line, London. As the region developed, the church became known as Bethel Presbyterian Church, Ilderton. The congregation rejected Church Union during the time of debate in 1925. The congregation dissolved in January 2015.

Historical Sketch

Innerkip Presbyterian Church (ON) was established around 1852 in the village of Melrose (ON). The name of the village changed early on to Innerkip. In 1853, the congregation purchased a piece of land from Mr. George Lee on which they built their first church. The first minister was the Rev. Andrew Tolmie, who served from 1852 until 1862. The congregations of Innerkip and Ratho were joined in a combined session until 1871. During 1871, the sessions were separated and the congregations continued as a two-point charge until they were completely separated in November of 2000.

Inverness, Quebec

Historical Sketch

St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church in Inverness, was first organized in 1838. In 1839, the first church ("Old Kirk") was erected, and in 1862, the present church was built. In 1925, when the United Church of Canada was founded, amalgamating the Methodist, Presbyterian, and Congregational Churches, the St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church decided not to join the Union. However, Inverness Methodist church did join, creating the Inverness United Church. In 1946, the Presbyterian and United Church congregations in Inverness joined together for worship, becoming the first congregations in Canada to co-operate in such a manner. Inverness United Church and St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church have had a shared ministry in place since 1960.

Historical Sketch

Knox Presbyterian Church, Iroquois was formed in 1874 as a congregation of the Church Presbyterian Church, with Rev. W. M. McKibbin as their first minister serving from 1874 to 1878. From its beginning in 1874 Knox, Iroquois was part of joint charge with what is now known as St. Andrew's and St. James, Cardinal. In 1878 the link with Cardinal was dissolved and Iroquois was linked to Knox, Morrisburg as two-point charge and with a joint Kirk Session. In 1884 the Session was divided in two and in 1886 Morrisburg became an independent charge. In 1887 Iroquois was linked with Matilda, Dixon's Corners as a two-point charge. In 1925 a majority of the congregation of Knox, Iroquois voted (100 to 7) to remain within the Presbyterian Church. In 1957, St. Andrew's, South Mountain was added to form a three-point charge and this continued until 1960 when the amalgamation of Matilda, Dixon's Corners with Knox, Iroquois reduced the pastoral charge to two congregations, Knox, Iroquois and St. Andrew's, South Mountain.

There is mention of land being donated for the first church building (and for a cemetery at Iroquois Point), but the year the brick church was built on College Street is not included in the Knox Centennial History. In 1892, land was donated on which the original manse was built, and a Sunday School Hall was built in 1932.

With the St. Lawrence Seaway Project requiring the town-site of Iroquois to be flooded and the town re-located, the old church building on College Street was demolished in 1957 and the new Knox church and manse were completed that year on the new Iroquois town site.

In July 2017, Knox amalgamated with St. Andrew's and St. James (Cardinal, Ontario) and the newly formed congregation took the name of Riverview Presbyterian Church.

[Note that the PCCA Finding Aid has different links and different dates for Knox -- From its beginning in 1874, Knox, Iroquois was part of a joint charge with Spencerville and Edwardsburgh. In 1876 the link with Spencerville was dissolved and Iroquois continued with Edwardsburgh alone until 1879. In 1879 that charge was dissolved, and Iroquois was linked with Morrisburg until 1887.]
