Historical Sketch

St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church was established in 1925 when those who were against Church Union decided to continue with The Presbyterian Church in Canada. The first service following Union was held February 18, 1925, in the Masonic Hall. The congregation opened a newly built church in 1926 and discharged the mortgage by 1930. The first minister after Church Union was the Rev. J. A. Kennedy. He served from 1927 to 1931. A new church building was built and was dedicated on November 2, 1958.

Trinity Presbyterian Church

Historical Sketch

In 1977 the first members of Trinity, under the leadership of Rev. Ralph Kendall, met in local schools in the sparsely populated and totally undeveloped lands of Kanata. By Feb. 1979, 29 members made the commitment to build a church. The result of that commitment was the completion and dedication of the “White Church on the Hill” in May of 1981. This first “passive solar” church in Canada was designed and built by architect Barry J. Hobin and Associate.

First Presbyterian Church

Historical Sketch

The congregation of First Presbyterian Church, Kenora had its beginnings in 1930 when members of the Knox United Church broke away to re-establish a Presbyterian presence in the community. The first church service was held at the Cecilia Jeffrey Indian Residential School in May 1930 and was led by E.W. Byers, principal of Cecilia Jeffrey. The following year the congregation moved to a building closer downtown and were organized as a formal congregation. The first minister was Rev. W.J. Pellow, and he served at the Church until 1931. After the purchase of a manse and adjoining property in 1949, the congregation made a formal decision to build a new church building. The cornerstone was laid in November 1954, and the building was finished by August 1955. The new church was dedicated on June 21, 1956, coinciding with the 25th anniversary of the congregation. First Presbyterian Church maintained many ties with Cecilia Jeffrey Indian Residential School. The congregation of First Presbyterian Church often held services or special events such as turkey suppers at the school. Members of the Cecilia Jeffrey choir would also perform at the Church on special occasions. Several staff members at the school including Ivan Robson and Stephen Robinson, both principals at Cecilia Jeffrey, served as ministers or elders of First Presbyterian Church. On May 30, 1971, a stained-glass window was placed in the Church and dedicated to the staff and students of Cecilia Jeffrey Indian Residential School. The congregation dissolved in September 2025.

Historical Sketch

Knox Presbyterian Church (Kent Bridge, Ont.) was established initially as a preaching station of Thamesville in 1887. It was an official Mission Station in 1892. By 1895, it was part of a three-point charge with Botany and MacKay's Corners. The Rev. J. A. Mustard was the first minister. In 1910, it was joined with Thamesville as a two-point charge. The congregation was closed sometime around 1990.

Historical Sketch

Killam Presbyterian Church in Killam, Alberta was established in 1907 as a mission within the Presbytery of Red Deer, with the first church building opening that year. The first minister, Rev. Lawrence Sully, was appointed in 1909. A new building was built in 1929 but shortly was destroyed in a fire in 1932. The present building was built after the disaster. St. Paul's Presbyterian Church in Galahad, Alberta amalgamated with Killam in December 2009. The congregation dissolved in October 2015.

Historical Sketch

Erskine Presbyterian Church, Killarney was organized in 1945, and the congregation was dissolved in 1992. A Presbyterian mission had been established in 1884 in Killarney and was established as a congregation in 1888. In 1925 the congregation voted to join the United Church of Canada. In 1944, the Rev. L.H. Henderson of First Presbyterian Church, Portage La Prairie conducted a service at Holiness Movement Church for Presbyterians in the area. This mission was organized as a congregation in 1944 with the ordination of Mr. D. Finleyson as an Elder and election of managers. In June of 1946 more Elders were elected, and the first session meeting was held July of 1947.

Services were held in Holiness Movement Church until a church building was completed in 1949.

Throughout its history as a congregation, Erskine operated as a mission, connected with a succession of other mission congregations and led variously, by ministers, catechists and students. In 1944, Erskine was linked with St. Andrew's, Boissevain, and Ninga Presbyterian Church, Ninga, an arrangement which continued until 1948. From 1948 to 1953 and again from 1957 to 1959, Erskine was linked with St. Paul's (later Knox), Bellafield and the Enterprise School congregation, Smith Hill, Man. From 1954 to 1956 Erskine and Bellefield were linked. In 1960, Erskine, Bellafield, Enterprise and the Henderson School were linked. From 1961 to 1964 Erskine, Bellefield and Enterprise were linked and finally, from 1965 until 1992, Erskine was linked to Bellafield and Ninga.

The congregation disbanded c.1885 and most members joined with Knox Presbyterian Church. West Church was formed in 1857 and was associated with the United Presbyterian Church. It amalgamated with Knox Presbyterian Church in 1871.

King Township, Ontario

History of Presbyterian Churches in the Township

This is a brief outline of the congregations in the township of King moving geographically from East to West. Congregations noted in this outline do not necessarily indicate that the PCC Archives has records of each congregation. Having said that, the linkages between the congregations and multipoint charges mean that there are constant overlaps in both records and congregations over time.

Second Line – Temperanceville known as East King church linked to congregation in Aurora and closed c. 1912

Third Line – Eversley – St. Andrew’s Presbyterian Church, founded in 1834, amalgamated with St. Andrew’s Strange in 1958 to form St. Andrew’s King City

Fourth Line – King City – **St. Andrew’s Presbyterian Church**

Sixth Line – Strange – St. Andrew’s Presbyterian Church founded in 1837, also known as St. Andrew’s King. Amalgamated with Eversley in 1958 and continued as St. Andrew’s King City moving to a new building in King City.

Sixth Line – Laskey – Laskey Presbyterian Church closed c. 1925 possible merger with Strange

Ninth Line – West King – St. Paul’s Presbyterian Church, became **St. Paul’s Nobleton** in 1958

Tenth Line – Beza / St. Andrew’s Presbyterian Church. Founded in 1859 name appears to have changed to St. Andrew’s c. 1940. Congregation closed c. 1957. Some members joined St. Paul’s Nobleton

Eleventh Line Church – c. 1866 – 1925

King City, Ontario

St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church

Historical Sketch

St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church, King City was established under the Presbyterian Church of Canada in connection with the Church of Scotland. The Rev. Gordon was inducted in 1834 as the first minister of St. Andrew's, King City, serving until 1837. At this time Rev. Gordon had a two-point charge of St. Andrew's King City and Newmarket. St. Andrew's, King City was linked with Laskay and Eversley. Eversley was also known as East King.

St. Andrew's, King City was built first of log construction, then was rebuilt in stone in 1860 or 1861. The congregations of St. Andrew's, King (Strange, Ont.) and St. Andrew's, Eversley were amalgamated at King City on 14 Dec. 1958 and were raised to self-supporting status in 1961.

Note: There is mention of other King area churches in Historical Sketch [1984-4007-1-25], however, it is not clear of their connections with St. Andrew's, King City or their names/locations. For example, there were three churches served by the Rev. James Charmichael during his ministry (1869-1910): St. Andrew's, King City on the Sixth Line, a brick church on the Third Line, and a stone church on the Tenth Line. It is not clear when the Tenth Line church was established. In the Acts and Proceedings of 1905, St. Andrew's King City was linked with Tenth Line, King and "West King". Then West King is mentioned in the PCCA Finding Aid Congregational Records I-P stating that St. Paul's Presbyterian Church, West King moved to Nobleton ON in 1958 and St. Paul's, Nobleton was raised to self-supporting status in 1961.

The Church on 10th Line King Township is also known as Beza Presbyterian Church.

The Church on 3rd Concession is Eversley Presbyterian Church.

St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church, Strange Ontario was located on 6th Line in King township.

Historical Sketch

The history of congregations in King Township Ontario dates back to the 1830's and they are very tangled.

10th Line congregation appears to have gone through a series of name changes and over the decades of operation has used the names Beza, St. Andrew's and Tenth Line. The name appears to have changed from 10th Line to St. Andrew's around 1940 according to the annual minutes, but this is unclear. Around 1956 there was a serious act of vandalism against the church building, and the congregation seems to have closed shortly thereafter. Some members moved on to St. Paul's Nobleton after its formation in 1958.

Kingston, Ontario

St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church

Last Updated: September 2025

Historical Sketch

St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church (Kingston, ON) was established in 1820 when the first church building was opened. The first minister to St. Andrew's was the Rev. Barclay. Rev. Barclay died at the age of 30 and was replaced by the Rev. Dr. Machar in 1827. The effect of the 1844 Disruption in Scotland was felt at St. Andrew's Kingston when three new churches were formed. Distinct groups split from St. Andrew's to form: a Free Church in connection with the Synod of the Presbyterian Church of Canada, and two churches in connection with the Presbytery of Ulster, Cooke's Church and Chalmers Church. The three churches united again in 1875 in The Presbyterian Church in Canada. The original church building was destroyed by fire in 1888 and was rebuilt in 1889. St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church (Kingston, ON) remained with The Presbyterian Church in Canada during the 1925 Church Union.

In 1956, the community began to hold worship services in the auditorium of a school. The group formed out of the Strathcona Park area was eventually able to purchase property and construct a church building. In 1974, an addition was dedicated to the congregation. Strathcona Park P.C. dissolved in 2022. The final service of the congregation was held on June 26, 2022.

Historical Sketch

Kinlough Presbyterian Church in Kinlough, Ontario was established at least by the early 1870s. It was also known as the North Kinloss church, distinguishing it from the congregation of South Kinloss in the southern part of the township. During its history the congregation has been linked with several other congregations in both two-point and three-point charges. From 1875 to 1882 Kinlough was part of a two-point charge with Bervie. From 1883 to 1909 it was linked to Riversdale and Enniskillen and in 1910, just with Riversdale. From 1911 to 1913 it was linked with Riversdale and Bervie, and from 1914 to 1925 once again with Riversdale only. At the time of Church Union in 1925, the congregation voted to remain Presbyterian. In 1926 Kinlough was linked with Kinloss (South Kinloss) an arrangement which continued until 1941. The two were linked again from 1950-1955. From 1942 to 1949 Kinlough, Kinloss and Bervie were linked, and since 1956, Kinlough has been linked with Knox, Teeswater.

Historical Sketch

Knox Presbyterian Church in Kintyre, Ontario (Township of Aldborough) was formed out of the congregation in New Glasgow in c.1856. A church building was constructed and opened in 1861. The two congregations of Kintyre and New Glasgow were joined together under one Session until 1874. Since 1961, Kintyre has been linked with Knox Church, New Glasgow and St. John's Church, Rodney as a three-point charge.

Bekevar Presbyterian Church

Historical Sketch

Bekevar began in 1900 with the arrival of five families from Hungary to what was then a part of the Northwest Territory of Assiniboia. For several years, they met for worship in their homes. In 1902, they welcomed their first Teaching Elder, Kalman Kovacsy, appointed by the Presbyterian Church in Canada. It was around this time that the congregation took the name Bekevar, meaning “fortress of peace”. Kovacsy was succeeded by Rev. John Kovachin 1907, who assisted the congregation in building their first church, the dedication of which took place in 1912. In 1917, Bekevar became a self-sustaining charge and in 1925 voted to remain with the Presbyterian Church in Canada. A new church building was constructed in 1967.

St. Columba's Presbyterian Church

Historical Sketch

St. Columba's Presbyterian Church, Kirk Hill began as the Lochiel Church and was established in 1819 in connection with the Church of Scotland. The first minister was the Rev. John McLaurin who served from 1819 to 1832. The first church, built in the early 1820s, was of frame construction. In 1846-47, a number of members from the Lochiel Church left to form the Lochiel "Free" Church. This Free Church congregation built a new stone church on the "West Hill" in Kirk Hill, which was opened and dedicated for worship in 1850. This congregation entered the United Church of Canada in 1925. In 1862, the name of the Lochiel Church (on the "East Hill") was changed to St. Columba's when a new stone church was built. A spire was completed in 1889, and the interior of the church was remodeled in 1927 where the seating capacity was reduced and choir room and Sunday School Room built. Up to 1911 the church had continued its connection to the Established Church of Scotland. In 1911, however, the congregation voted to join The Presbyterian Church in Canada. In 1925 the congregation voted (131 to 11) to remain within the Presbyterian Church. St. Columba's was linked with Kenyon Presbyterian Church, Dunvegan as a two-point charge in 1996 and this arrangement continues to the present.

Historical Sketch

Kirkwall Presbyterian Church (Ont.) was established in 1833 by the Rev. Thomas Christie. The congregation met in a log cabin built to house the early settlers of the region. A log church was built in 1835. The Rev. James Roy was inducted following the departure of the Rev. Christie. A stone church was built on the same site in 1848. In 1912, Kirkwall united with Sheffield as a two-point charge. This relationship lasted until 1925 when Sheffield chose to enter into Union and Kirkwall chose to remain with The Presbyterian Church in Canada. Following this separation, Kirkwall united for a time with West Flamboro.

In July 1953, plans were made to erect a church in Doon. Land for the church was donated by the family of the Hon. Adam Ferrie. The church was opened in December 1954, but the congregation wasn't formally organized until October 1855. At this time, the congregation became part of a two-point charge with Hespeler. In 1892 when Hespeler became self-sustaining, Doon joined with Knox in Preston at a two-point charge. This arrangement lasted until 1977. An extension to the building was added in 1980.

Historical Sketch

In 1854 Persons of Scottish descent began to meet in private homes to worship in the Church of Scotland format familiar to them. As more people joined in the house worship, the little group needed a larger space and began to worship in the schoolhouse on the fire hall lot on Frederick Street. In 1855 the group worshipping in the schoolhouse, petitioned the Presbytery of Hamilton to be established as a Presbyterian congregation. The petition, presented by The Rev. Dr. Smellie of Fergus, the Rev. James Young of Guelph, and Sheriff George Davidson of Berlin, was granted on Jan. 23, 1855.

In 1857 the congregation dedicated its first church building. It was a brick structure with a seating capacity of 175 built at a cost of \$4,500. In 1874 a wooden "Sabbath School" building was erected behind the church. The corner stone for the "Sabbath School" building is visible near the Weber Street doors. By 1907 the congregation numbered 600 people. The original wooden building was torn down and replaced by the present brick sanctuary to accommodate the larger congregation. The present sanctuary was dedicated on September 8, 1907

On January 21, 1925, the congregation of St. Andrew's voted against joining with Methodist and Congregational Churches to form the United Church of Canada. In 2014 St. Andrew's celebrated its 160th Anniversary with thanks and praise to God.

Historical Sketch

Cornerstone Community Church in Kleinburg, Ontario, was formerly named Woodbridge Presbyterian Church (Vaughan, Ont.) which was established in 1874 by the Rev. Peter Nicol. The congregation was officially organized in 1875. For the first three years, services were held in the Temperance Hall. A church building was dedicated in December of 1877. The first minister was the Rev. R. Pettigrew who served from 1875 until 1884. Woodbridge Presbyterian Church remained with The Presbyterian Church in Canada during the time of Church Union in 1925. Knox Presbyterian Church, Vaughan amalgamated with Woodbridge in 1961. Knox Presbyterian Church, Vaughan was originally organized in 1845 as a United Presbyterian congregation linked with Albion. In 1875 the congregation took the name of Knox. In 1876 the link with Albion was dissolved and Knox was linked with Bolton. In 1902 the charges were re-organized, and Knox, Vaughan was linked with Woodbridge while Bolton was linked with Nashville. In 1925 the minister, the Rev. J.A. Moir entered the United Church of Canada, but the congregation remained Presbyterian. In 1961 Knox was amalgamated with Woodbridge. Woodbridge Presbyterian Church was re-named Cornerstone Community Church on March 21, 2006.
