St. Peter's Presbyterian Church

Historical Sketch

St. Peter's Presbyterian Church (Madoc, ON) was organized beginning in 1836 with occasional supply from Kingston. During the Disruption of 1844, Presbyterian families in Madoc aligned themselves with the Presbytery of Kingston in connection with the Presbyterian Church of Canada and continued to receive missionary supply. A church building was opened in 1850. The first minister to be inducted was the Rev. J.W. Chestnut. He was officially inducted in 1853. In 1866, four Presbyterian churches were built to correspond with the four mission stations in the area. These churches were given names to avoid confusion in the community. The church at Madoc was named St. Peter's Presbyterian Church. During the time of Church Union in 1925, the final vote at St. Peter's was 39 for and 103 against. Thus, St. Peter's Presbyterian Church remained with The Presbyterian Church in Canada.

Magnetawan, Ontario

Knox Presbyterian Church

Historical Sketch

Knox Presbyterian Church (Magnetawan, Ont.) was established as a mission in 1878. It was initially linked with the Spence congregation. In 1898 Magnetawan was linked with Dunchurch and Ahmic Harbour. This union lasted until 1903 when Magnetawan was linked with the Spence and Croft (Ahmic Lake) congregations. During the four years from 1914-1918, the Presbyterian and Methodist congregations in Magnetawan shared ministers. At the time of Church Union in 1925, Knox chose to remain with The Presbyterian Church in Canada. In 1959, Knox, Magnetawan, Burks Falls and Sundridge formed a self-supporting three-point charge.

Historical Sketch

St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church (Maple, ON) was organized in 1829 when a number of inhabitants of the township of Vaughn decided to build a church. The Rev. P. McNaughton was inducted as the first minister in 1832. An early church structure was built about 1832. In 1862, during the ministry of the Rev. Donald Ross, new church building was opened. The congregation was closely associated with St. Paul's (Vaughan, ON). The congregation of St. Andrew's (Maple, ON) voted to remain with The Presbyterian Church in Canada during Church Union in 1925.

Historical Sketch

St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church (Maple Valley, Ont.) was organized in 1863 by the Rev. John Campbell. The first church building was opened on July 12, 1863. The congregation was known as the Osprey congregation around 1869. It was at this time that the congregation was united with Creemore and Dunedin. The first minister was the Rev. Duncan McDonald who ministered to the three-point charge. By 1872 the congregation was a part of a charge with Singhampton and Dunedin. During the time of Church Union, St. Andrew's originally voted to enter Union, and the non-concurring Presbyterians left the congregation. In 1926, the vote was declared null and void and the Presbyterians reunited.

Historical Sketch

Cooke's Presbyterian Church, Markdale was established in 1930 following Church Union, when a majority of the congregation joined with Annesley United Church, and the minority remaining members reverted to The Presbyterian Church in Canada. The original congregation was established in the 1870s. In 1930, the congregation was linked with Flesherton Presbyterian Church and in 1931 with Priceville and Swinton Park. In 1962 Burn's Presbyterian Church, Feversham was added to this charge. In 1966 Priceville was detached and transferred to the Presbytery of Saugeen, and Dundalk, Feversham and Markdale were united as a pastoral charge. In 1976 Cooke's, Markdale and Burn's, Feversham were separated from Dundalk and Swinton Park to form a separate two-point pastoral charge.

St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church (Maxville, Ont.) was formed in 1824. The name of the congregation was originally Indian Lands Presbyterian Church (Glengarry County, Ont.). Shortly after its formation, a log church was built and was referred to as Beech Church due to the large Beech trees used in its construction. A frame church was constructed on land bought from John MacEwan Sr. in 1826. This church would later be referred to as the White Church. The Rev. Archibald Connell was the minister to Indian Lands and Martintown. In August of 1839, Indian Lands inducted the Rev. Daniel Clark as minister to their single point charge. Following the Disruption in Scotland, the Rev. Clark and a significant number of the congregation left the Indian Lands church to form a new Canada Presbyterian Church (Free Church) congregation, and the Indian Lands church became a mission station of the Church of Scotland. The new Free Church congregation became known as the Gordon Church, St. Elmo. During the Union of 1875, the two separate congregations came together again and were known as St. Elmo Presbyterian Church. In 1887, the congregation was so large that a split was proposed. A number of the congregation left St. Elmo and became St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church (Maxville, Ont.). The first minister to this charge was the Rev. John MacLeod. A church building for the new congregation was completed in 1900. During the time of Church Union in 1925, St. Andrew's chose to remain a part of The Presbyterian Church in Canada.

St. John's Presbyterian Church, Medicine Hat was first established as a mission charge in 1883 with the first building erected in 1884. This building was also used by the local School Board to house the school for some years. With expansion in the West, the congregation was first under the jurisdiction of the Presbytery of Manitoba, then the Presbytery of Brandon in 1885, Regina in 1886 and Calgary in 1887. In 1914 the Presbytery of Medicine Hat was constituted but in 1925 after only two congregations remained in The Presbyterian Church in Canada, the Presbytery of Medicine Hat was dissolved, and St. John's was placed in the Presbytery of Calgary (later Calgary-MacLeod).

With the establishment of the Presbyterian Training School in Medicine Hat, St. John's became active in church extension, assisting with the establishment of Riverside Presbyterian Church in 1956 connected with the Training School.

Valetta Presbyterian Church (Merlin, Ont.) was organized in 1846 by the Rev. Sutherland of Ekfrid. The congregation began by meeting in the home of Angus Grant of Tilbury East (later Valetta). The Rev. Angus McColl was the first inducted minister in 1848 to the joint charge of Chatham and Tilbury East. The first log church was built in 1849. In 1857, Tilbury East (Valetta) was joined with Tilbury West (Knox) as a two-point charge. The United Secession Church joined with Valetta in 1861, and a new church was built to accommodate the larger congregation. In 1888, Valetta and Fletcher were united as a two-point charge. A brick church was finished and dedicated on June 19, 1904. The interior of the new church was damaged by fire in 1906. The union with Fletcher ended in 1925 as Valetta chose to remain a part of The Presbyterian Church in Canada, while Fletcher chose to enter the United Church of Canada. Following Union, Valetta was joined in a two-point charge with New St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church, Dover.

This unity ended in 1884 when Knox separated with the Rev. David James as their minister. The congregation opened a new church in October of 1887. This building was torn down in 1902 and replaced by a new brick church which was completed in 1903. During the time of Church Union in 1925, Knox chose to remain a part of The Presbyterian Church in Canada.

Historical Sketch

Bethany Presbyterian Church was formed in 1917 in Milan as a result of a split within the St. Luke's Presbyterian Church congregation in Hampden. The two churches then formed one congregation, but each had its own board of managers until the closure of St. Luke's Presbyterian Church in 1944. In 1925, when the United Church of Canada was formed, Bethany Presbyterian Church did not join and remained Presbyterian. In 1975, Bethany Presbyterian Church and St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church in Lake Megantic were merged with St. Paul's Presbyterian Church in Scotstown, forming one congregation of three separate preaching stations with a common communion roll and session, and separate boards of managers. In 1980, the two churches were totally amalgamated with St. Paul's Presbyterian Church in Scotstown.

Historical Sketch

Grace Presbyterian Church (Millbrook, Ont.) was established in 1834. On March 26, 1834, the Rev. James Douglas was inducted into the pastoral charge of Centreville and Millbrook. Millbrook and Centreville were separated in 1890 and Millbrook joined with Garden Hill as part of a two-point charge. In 1896, the old brick church was destroyed by fire. A new church building was constructed and opened on January 17, 1897. Prior to May 15, 1915, the church had been known as Millbrook Presbyterian Church, in 1915, the name was changed to Grace Presbyterian Church. Following Church Union in 1925, Grace Presbyterian chose to remain with The Presbyterian Church in Canada, but Garden Hill chose to enter the United Church of Canada, thus their connection was severed. Grace Presbyterian then joined with Centreville. In 1998, Grace was fully amalgamated with Centreville Presbyterian Church (South Monaghan, Ont.).

Historical Sketch

Knox Presbyterian Church, Milton was established in 1855 as a congregation of the Presbyterian Free Church. It began as a mission station of Boston Free Presbyterian Church, Esquesing, being formed by the members of the Boston congregation who lived in Milton. It was referred to as "Knox's" or the "Free Church" until it took the name of Knox Presbyterian Church in 1866. The first minister Rev. James Mitchell served the Boston and Milton congregations from 1856 to 1869. The two congregations remained linked until 1887, when Knox became a self-supporting congregation. The Knox congregation built their first church (stone) on Martin Street, completed in 1857. A second (present) brick church at 170 Main Street East was completed in 1891. The Martin Street church was sold in 1892. In 1925 Knox voted (235 to 75) to remain within the Presbyterian Church in Canada. Knox shared some services with St. Paul's Methodist Church (later St. Paul's United), in 1918, in the early 1940s for economic reasons. Joint services with St. Paul's were also held on Sunday evenings in the 1950s.

Hornby Presbyterian Church was established in 1838 and was linked at various times with Boston, Esquesing and Omagh. In 1930 Hornby was designated a Mission Field and under the care of Knox, Milton and in 1971, Hornby was amalgamated with Knox. Knox built a manse at 95 Martin Street in 1881 (sold in 1890); a second manse at 174 Main St. was purchased in 1890 (sold in 1924); a third manse at 79 Martin Street was bought in 1924 (sold in 1970); and the present manse at 245 Garnet St. was bought in 1971.

Burns Presbyterian Church, Milverton, (originally known as West's Corners) was organized in 1857 in the Presbytery of Brant of the United Presbyterian Church. The Rev. Alexander Drummond was the first minister. The Rev. Thomas Lowry served as minister from 1861 until 1867. During the Rev. Lowry's ministry, the first frame church was built on Mill Street. A brick church was built in 1887. Burns church was linked with Hampstead in 1858, with North Mornington (also called Gamble's Settlement) from 1861-1886, with Zion Church, Wellesley, from 1888-1909 and again with North Mornington in 1930.

Dixie was part of a two-point charge with Malton in 1879, Port Credit was added to this charge in 1892. Malton was removed from the charge around 1897. In 1913, Port Credit became independent and Dixie joined with St. James, Long Branch. In 1947, Dixie became an independent congregation. Historical Sketch

St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church (Mississauga, ON) was organized in what was formerly known as Streetsville. The first small church building was built in 1824 and was supplied by visiting ministers until the Rev. Andrew Bell became the first minister in 1828. A Sabbath School was started in 1835 under the direction of John Embleton as superintendent. During the Disruption the congregation voted unanimously to renounce the Established Church of Scotland and became members of the Presbyterian Church of Canada. A new church building was built between 1867 and 1870. An organ was introduced to the congregation shortly after 1871. During the time of Church Union in 1925, the congregation of St. Andrew's remained with The Presbyterian Church in Canada.

Historical Sketch

Mistawasis Memorial Presbyterian Church was established at the Mistawasis Nehiyawak First Nation shortly after the signing of Treaty Six in 1876. With weekly worship services, a girl's program for adolescents, and a sewing initiative, the church meets the needs of the community in tangible ways. The local culture upholds Indigenous language and familial practices to this day.

Mistawasis Memorial Presbyterian Church seeks to honour these practices. Much of the ministry is based in an ongoing connection with the local Health Centre, which allows them to use their building when the roads are impassable, and coordinate programming based on the needs in the community.

Note

In a recent discussion with a member of the congregation, it was learned that the first church building burnt down sometime in the 1930s. Majority of the records were lost with that fire. Since then, there has been an issue with ministers improperly maintaining records of the congregation, which has resulted in a small collection of materials. There may be records deposited with the City of Regina Archives (unconfirmed).

Historical Sketch

Knox Presbyterian Church (Mitchell, Ont.) was organized in 1849 by the Rev. Thomas Macpherson who gave the congregation its name, Knox. Presbyterian services had been held in Mitchell as early as 1846. On September 11, 1856, the Rev. James Findlay was inducted into the charge. A church building was completed and dedicated in January of 1858. This church was replaced by a church dedicated on September 9, 1894. During the time of Church Union in 1925, the majority of Knox's congregation voted to remain a part of The Presbyterian Church in Canada.

Historical Sketch

St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church (Molesworth, Ont.) was established as a congregation in 1863 as part of a four-point charge with Monkton, Atwood and Listowel. Attempts to organize a congregation had been made as early as 1861. A church building was constructed at Molesworth in 1868. The charge was separated this year and Listowel and Molesworth remained together. They called the Rev. J. W. Bell to be their minister. The Presbytery of Stratford separated Molesworth and Listowel in 1876 and Molesworth united with the newly formed Trowbridge. Molesworth became a lone self-supporting congregation in 1889. A new church was dedicated in November 1897; it was at this time that the name St. Andrew's was chosen. During the time of Church Union in 1925, the majority of the St. Andrew's congregation chose to remain a part of The Presbyterian Church in Canada. Shortly after Union, St. Andrew's was united with Gorrie as a two-point charge.

Historical Sketch

St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church, Monkland began in 1906 as the new village of Monkland was growing with the advent of the Canadian Pacific Railway. Members of the nearby Gravel Hill congregation living in Monkland and others, participated in weekly prayer meetings in Truax's or MacGillivray's Hall in Monkland. Services were conducted by the Rev. Hector N. MacLean and from 1907 to 1909, the Rev. James Hastie was minister of Gravel Hill and Monkland. In 1909, a student minister, Mr. Andrew Drysdale, assumed pastoral duties from Rev. Hastie. The Town of Monkland was flourishing by this time and that year a building lot was purchased. Permission was granted to build, and a frame church was completed that year and named St. Andrew's in recognition of the efforts of Mr. Drysdale in raising funds for construction. St. Andrew's Monkland was linked with St. James' Gravel Hill from 1907 to 1937 and was served by ordained and student ministers. In 1937 Gravel Hill and Monkland were linked with St. Andrew's Avonmore and this arrangement continued until St. Andrew's Monkland was closed in 1998. The pews and pulpit of St. Andrew's were donated to the National Presbyterian Museum. The congregations of St. Andrew's and St. James' Gravel Hill merged to form the congregation of St. James' - St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church.

Côte Street Free Church was established in 1845 following the disruption of the Presbyterian Church of Canada in connection with the Church of Scotland. In 1847, the church building was located on the east side of Côte St. just above St. Antoine (Craig St.). In 1877-1878, following the 1875 union of Presbyterian denomination in Canada, the congregation erected a new building on Dorchester at Crescent Street and was re-named Crescent Street Presbyterian Church. In 1918 Crescent Street Church united with Knox Church and the new congregation was named Knox Church, Crescent Street: this became shortened to Knox-Crescent Church.

In 1984, Knox-Crescent-Kensington amalgamated with First Presbyterian Church and became Knox, Crescent, Kensington, & First Presbyterian Church.

First Presbyterian Church was established in 1909 upon the amalgamation of St. Gabriel Presbyterian Church and Chalmers Presbyterian Church, Montreal. Knox-Crescent Church was formed in 1918 with the amalgamation of Crescent Street Church (originally est. in 1845 and called Cote Street Free Church) and Knox Church. In 1977 Meville Presbyterian Church in Westmount amalgamated with Knox-Crescent-Kensington. In 2012 the congregation adopted the name of Kensington Presbyterian Church.

The Kydd family provided land and considerable sums of money for the project. The new building was named Kydd Memorial Presbyterian Church. The Rev. Kenneth C. MacLennan was the first inducted minister. In 1951, the congregation became self-supporting. The congregation of Fairmount-Taylor Presbyterian Church was fully amalgamated with Kydd in 1969. The congregation of Kydd Memorial Presbyterian Church was dissolved on May 31, 1982.

Historical Sketch

In 1888, the Session of Erskine Church passed a resolution to hire an assistant for mission work in the east end of Montreal, then known as the village of Maisonneuve. The first public worship of this mission took place in a rented building in December 1888. In 1890 a meeting was held to elect a Board of Managers, and at a subsequent meeting, the Board settled on the name Maisonneuve Presbyterian Church. Services were led by Rev. Warden of Erskine Church along with various lay people until 1897, when Rev. W. M. MacKeracher became minister. A new church building was constructed in 1908. 1922 saw the formation of St. Cuthbert's Presbyterian Church, which had begun as a mission in the Hochelaga district c.1917. Maisonneuve and St. Cuthbert's merged in 1963, forming Maisonneuve-St. Cuthbert's Presbyterian Church. In 2001, Beckwith Memorial-St. Michel Presbyterian Church amalgamated with Maisonneuve-St. Cuthbert's under the name Maisonneuve-St. Cuthbert's. Beckwith Memorial and St. Michel had previously merged in 1997. In 2006, the name of the congregation changed to Église presbytérienne de Maisonneuve/Maisonneuve Presbyterian Church. In 2023, Maisonneuve amalgamated with La Communauté chrétienne Siloë Canada.

Historical Sketch

Mount Royal Presbyterian Church was established in 1943 when the congregation of Mount Royal entered the Presbyterian Church in Canada from the United Church of Canada. The congregation's roots can be traced back to 1880 and the Methodist Church. In 1925 Mount Royal Avenue Church became part of the United Church of Canada. Due to the depression and the changing demographics in the area of Mount Royal, the congregation went into decline and incurred substantial debts. The United Church decided to sell the church building and to force an amalgamation with St. James United Church. A number of the Mount Royal congregation did not appreciate this step and sought to separate themselves from the United Church. They applied to The Presbyterian Church in Canada in 1942 and were formally accepted as a congregation in 1943. There were conditions placed on their membership in the Presbyterian Church in Canada. One of these conditions was that the congregation would never become a financial burden to the Presbytery, and if they were to become a burden, they were to voluntarily amalgamate with another congregation of their choosing. The congregation rented space in their old building which had been sold to the Church of Jesus Christ the Latter-Day Saints. Disagreements over arrangements between the two congregations resulted in a decline in Mount Royal's membership and attendance. By 1949, Mount Royal realized that it was unable to honour the agreement it had made with The Presbyterian Church in Canada and petitioned the Presbytery to sanction the cessation of the congregation. Mount Royal agreed to amalgamate with Outremont Presbyterian Church in 1950.

Historical Sketch

Outremont-Mount Royal Presbyterian Church (Montreal, PQ) was established in 1950 with the amalgamation of Outremont Presbyterian Church (Montreal, PQ) and Mount Royal Presbyterian Church (Montreal, PQ). The congregation of Outremont-Mount Royal was amalgamated with Fairmount-Taylor Presbyterian Church (Montreal, PQ) in July 1962.

St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church

Historical Sketch

St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church was established in 1803 by a dissident minority of St. Gabriel Street Presbyterian Church (First Presbyterian Church) which seceded to form a separate congregation. Initially this new congregation had connections with the Presbyterian Churches in the United States but in 1824 the congregation called a Church of Scotland minister and became connected with the Church of Scotland, while a minority of Americans withdrew to form the American Presbyterian Church of Montreal (which entered the United Church of Canada in 1925). In 1875 when The Presbyterian Church in Canada was formed, a majority of the St. Andrew's congregation, with their minister, the Rev. Gavin Lang, opposed the union and did not enter The Presbyterian Church in Canada, remaining connected with the Church of Scotland. The minority who favored union amalgamated with St. Paul's, Montreal, after attempting to maintain a separate congregation. In 1918, after the membership had dwindled, St. Andrew's amalgamated with St. Paul's as the Church of St. Andrew and St. Paul, thereby entering The Presbyterian Church in Canada.

Historical Sketch

The Church of St. Andrew and St. Paul, Montreal, was formed by the amalgamation of St. Andrew's Church (Church of Scotland) (est. 1803) and St. Paul's Presbyterian Church (est. 1832) in 1918. The present building was built in 1930. St. Andrew's was originally called St. Peter's Street Presbyterian church; it is unclear when the name was changed.

Historical Sketch

St. Gabriel Street Presbyterian Church, Montreal was founded in 1786, and the first building was erected in 1792. The first building was located on the southwest corner of Champ de Mars. In 1866, the building was expropriated by the Quebec government for a courthouse. At this time the congregation moved to St. Catherine Street, east of Phillips Square opposite the present St. James United Church. The congregation divided in 1803 over a decision on whom to call as a minister and the dissident minority, who preferred to be connected with an American Presbytery rather than the Church of Scotland, formed St. Peter Street congregation, re-named St. Andrew's in 1824. In 1831 another group withdrew to form St. Paul's Presbyterian Church. In 1844 at the Disruption the majority supported the Free Church, but the property was disputed and the Free Church majority erected a separate building, which became Cote Street Free Church. In 1875 St. Gabriel Street congregation entered The Presbyterian Church in Canada. In 1887 the church building was acquired by the Presbytery of Quebec and the congregation moved to a building on St. Catherine Street. In 1909 the congregation amalgamated with Chalmer's Presbyterian Church, taking the name First Presbyterian Church. In 1909, upon amalgamation with Chalmers, a new building was built at the northwest corner of Jeanne Mance and Prince Arthur. In 1984, First was amalgamated with Knox, Crescent and Kensington, to form Knox, Crescent, Kensington and First Presbyterian Church.

St. Paul's Presbyterian Church was established in 1832 following the decision of the Presbytery of Montreal to divide St. Gabriel Street congregation into two. St. Paul's was connected with the Presbyterian Church of Canada in connection with the Church of Scotland until 1875 when the congregation entered The Presbyterian Church in Canada. In 1897 members of St. Andrew's who chose to enter The Presbyterian Church in Canada joined St. Paul's, and in 1918 St. Andrew's and St Paul's were amalgamated as the Church of St. Andrew and St. Paul.

Stanley Street Presbyterian Church (Montreal, PQ) was established in 1874. The congregation was formed of members and adherents of Erskine Presbyterian Church (Montreal, PQ), who left following the introduction of instrumental music to Erskine's worship services. A new church building was opened December 27, 1874. The first minister was the Rev. J. C. Baxter, who was inducted May 7, 1875. The Stanley Street congregation remained with the Presbyterian Church in Canada during Church Union in 1925. The congregation was dissolved March 18, 1986.

St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church in Mooretown was founded c.1856 when the Rev. James Gould served the pastorate of Bear Creek, Corunna and Mooretown. Presbyterians in the area had been served earlier by the Rev. Archibald Giekie, a Congregational Church minister from Scotland, who ministered to the settlers from about 1843 to 1849. During this time a church building was constructed which was used by the Presbyterians. After Rev. Gould resigned in 1860 the congregation was sporadically served by student ministers, until 1872, when the Rev. James McKutcheon arrived. He served as minister to the Mooretown, Corunna and Moore congregations, until his death in 1889. In 1885, the church building was purchased by the Mooretown congregation from the Giekie estate, but by 1890 it was decided to build a new church in the village of Mooretown. Around 1914, a new congregation in Courtright was established and linked with Mooretown and Corunna, but by the early 1950s it was amalgamated with Mooretown.

Historical Sketch

Wellspring Presbyterian Church was formed on January 1, 2013, through the amalgamation of Murray Harbour North Presbyterian Church, Murray Harbour Presbyterian Church, Caledonia Presbyterian Church, and Peter's Road Presbyterian Church.

Murray Harbour North Presbyterian Church, organized in 1822, is the oldest of the four congregations. From 1891 to 1962, it shared a single minister and session with Peter's Road Presbyterian Church. In 1962, these two congregations joined with Caledonia and Murray Harbour to form the Murray Harbour North Pastoral Charge, which continued until the four congregations amalgamated in 2013.

Murray Harbour Presbyterian Church (also known as Alister Murray Memorial Presbyterian Church) appears to have been formed around 1925 by a minority of members from the Murray Harbour South and Murray River churches, both of which later entered the United Church of Canada. Caledonia Presbyterian Church dates from approximately 1880, while Peter's Road Presbyterian Church was established around 1884.

Historical Sketch

Murrayville Presbyterian Church was established in 1925 by the non-concurring minority of Sharon Presbyterian Church, Murrayville. Sharon Presbyterian Church was originally established as Langley Prairie mission station in the 1890s and became part of a four-point charge. In the late 1950s, Beaver Presbyterian Church, Coghlan, was amalgamated with Murrayville Presbyterian Church, and in 1980 Murrayville was amalgamated with Langley Presbyterian Church.
