Historical Sketch

Ratho Presbyterian Church, Ratho began with the building of a frame church in 1852 on land donated the previous year. Services were conducted by ministers in the area until the Rev. Andrew Tolmie was inducted in 1853. A manse was built in on Lot 9, Concession 8 in Blandford Township. In 1865 a second manse (presumably replacing the first) was built just south of Ratho church – this as destroyed by fire in 1871 and rebuilt the same year. In 1891 a third manse was built beside the church in Innerkip and the Ratho manse was sold the following year.

In 1859 the name of the church was changed from The Free Church of Blandford to Blandford Presbyterian Church, then in 1860 the church was known as the Presbyterian Church of Ratho and in 1874, the Ratho Presbyterian Congregation.

In 1861 Ratho had joined with Innerkip congregation to form a two-point charge, an arrangement which continued until the year 2000, when Ratho continued on its own.

Samuel Farley would be the new congregation's first minister and the church building was completed in January 1927.

Historical Sketch

Norman Kennedy Presbyterian Church was formed in 1969 by the amalgamation of Northside Presbyterian Church (Regina, Sask.) and Calvin Presbyterian Church (Regina, Sask.). Northside Presbyterian Church started after the 1925 vote on Church Union when several people expressed their desire to continue in the Presbyterian Church. Calvin Presbyterian Church began in 1951 under the leadership of Rev. George Cunningham. The new building for Norman Kennedy Presbyterian Church opened in 1975.

Historical Sketch

The congregation began in the Hillsdale suburb in November 1956 when a Sunday School was organized in the McVeety Public School. It was originally known as Hillsdale Presbyterian Church. In 1958, the committee organized to operate the Sunday School applied to have a regular mission congregation established and the name St. Stephen's was chosen. Plans for a new church building were started in 1961 and the first services were held in April 1963. The congregation dissolved in June 1994.

Historical Sketch

In 1819 the Richmond Bay Charge, formerly part of the Princetown Richmond Bay Charge, became a separate charge with its own minister, Rev. Andrew Nicholl. The charge originally consisted of churches at Lots 14 and 16. Throughout its later history, it has been a congregation consisting of four church buildings under one Session. The four churches are Freeland Presbyterian Church, Tyne Valley Presbyterian Church, Lot 14 Presbyterian Church (dissolved 2019), and Victoria West Presbyterian Church.

Historical Sketch

The Mount Zion congregation was organized in March 1854 under the leadership of the Rev. William King of Buxton, Ontario. That same year their first church building was erected, and the congregation was first called the Presbyterian Church of Ridgetown. The first minister, the Rev. William Forrest, was inducted on 18 February 1857. The second building was erected in May 1879 and in 1880 was dedicated and received its new name, Mount Zion. Originally the congregation took in the whole area including: Thamesville, Botany and Duart. In 1880 Duart left to become a separate congregation.

Historical Sketch

Knox Presbyterian Church in Ripley, Ontario, was formed in 1925 by those members of St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church that voted against joining the United Church of Canada. St. Andrew's was originally est. c.1856 and had formerly been called Knox Presbyterian Church. The post union Knox congregation worshipped in the Township Hall for a time before purchasing the old Knox Presbyterian Church from the United Church. The first settled minister was the Rev. Dr. George Connors, who was inducted on Feb. 14, 1927. In that year, the congregation also built a Sunday School Hall. In 1938, the Ripley and Ashfield congregations were linked together as a two-point charge. The congregation dissolved in 2019.

St. Paul's separated from the charge in 1954.

Historical Sketch

The congregation of St. John's Presbyterian Church in Rodney, Ontario was formed in the 1870s under the guidance of the Rev. J.M. Munroe of Knox Presbyterian Church in New Glasgow. A church in Rodney was built in 1877 and a manse in the late 1880s. The congregation was joined with Knox, New Glasgow until 1925, and then linked with them as a two-point charge until 1961. Since 1961, it has been part of a three-point charge with Knox, New Glasgow and Knox, Kintyre. The congregation voted by a slim majority to remain part of The Presbyterian Church in Canada at the time Church Union in 1925.
